MARY HAWORTH Must Present The Truth

Dear Mary Haworth: The women in our club think you need a vacation. We were all so pleased with your counsel at first but lately you've written in a tired, disillusioned, crochety vein. Or is someone else doing your work for you? That we can't believe. You shouldn't let your own religious theories sway you so much, in advising others who perhaps have different views. For example, there was a great contrast between answers given by you and another newspaper counsellor recently. In both cases, young divorcees had written, complaining of loneliness and asking how to find companionship and meet men. Your reply was to live a quiet life and pray—or something to that effect. The other expert said "get out in the world and meet men—and even mentioned places where to find them. Which is what these

women want. **PREFER SYMPATHY** And weren't you pretty short with the young wife who complains of being tied down with a baby, presently unable to get out and be sociable? Most of us have been through that stage, so we know she needs real sympathy and understanding—not referral to a psychologist. While girls are growing up and being educated, they are led to believe they're real persons, with talents and abilities. Then after marriage they are suddenly restricted, with little chance to get out—as baby sitters are scarce and costly, and husbands often unsympathetic. Young wives need practical advice on how to surmount these difficulties; and often the husbands need advice, too. As schools have failed to prepare girls for this period of life, you counsellors should fill the gap. It is fine to recommend books, to supplement your advice; but you shouldn't do it to ease your own burden. Being told to read a book or see a psychiatrist can be pretty exasperating. . . . I have a friend who is a psychiatrist, but his own life is so involved and he so cynical, that he would be the worst possible therapist. **BRIGHT FUTURE** Finally, we're not at all sure that you and other advice-givers should always encourage a couple to stay together, who are incompatible and quarrelsome, like a couple of cats tied over a line. Perhaps a trial separation is better, to show how much each needs the other—especially if there are no children, or the children are grown. Friend Mary, you need rest and some new reading matter. You have a hard job and it's getting you down. We have lots of faith in you; and think you can do an even better job in future. All the best. S. F. **LET GOD RULE** Dear S. F.: You astonish me. I never felt less tired, disillusioned or crochety. The truth is I feel wonderful; and in fact had been thinking my counsel was getting better, nowadays, because administered in more serene spirit. Years ago I used to tackle every subject with furious energy, that some readers mistook for ill humor! I've since learned that God runs the universe, and that I can afford to disfunction in a less urgent way—and probably be more helpful because of not trying to do it all! Now about letting my religious theories sway me, in advising others with perhaps different views. One's religious sense is a part of what one is. And since I advise only those persons who ask my advice, I assume they want to know MY viewpoint—which naturally will incorporate what I honestly believe to be true of life. The person who aims to be all things to all people has no viewpoint—but only the self-

serving purpose, of trying to please. And the person who tries to please everybody, pleases nobody. So shall we just settle for being forthright. **NEED FAITH** As for my alleged advice to a lonely divorcee, to lead a quiet life and pray, you've got me confused with somebody else, I think—or you've got the story all mixed-up. My only recently lonely-heart problem of that type concerned a youthful widow who has dates and occasional beaux, but none with honorable intent—and she wants marriage. She lives in a man-scarce town, and I told her to upset the law of averages, which are against her, by learning to use constructive thinking to her advantage. And so I furnished a list of books that give invaluable know-how along this line. Quite a different matter from advocating passive praying. "Faith without works is dead," you know. And people have got to learn to think for themselves, before they can ever take profit from outside guidance. I try to prod them into this kind of learning. As for the young mother's rejecting attitude towards the disciplines of wifehood and motherhood on a shoestring, she needs more than sympathy. She needs insight, perspective and a general toning-up of her will-to-do. This I gave her, in capsule dose, and told her where to get more of the same. Too bad we each have to work for wisdom that sticks to us, but that's the way life is. Thank you all for your genuinely friendly interest. M. H. Found Russian People Friendly

MONTREAL (CP)—Mme. Jacques Beaudry, recently returned from a tour of Russia with orchestra-conductor husband, says she found the Russian people uniformly friendly but varying in temperament. "Just as in the United States or Europe, the people of the south of Russia are more exuberant more enthusiastic than their northern counterparts," she said Friday in an interview. On the invitation of the Soviet ministry of culture, Mr. Beaudry was guest conductor of Russian orchestras in seven major cities. Whenever he rehearsed, Mme. Beaudry was somewhere in the audience. "I never missed any of the 22 rehearsals," she said. "Many Russians liked to attend the rehearsals, too—something not often done in Canada."
