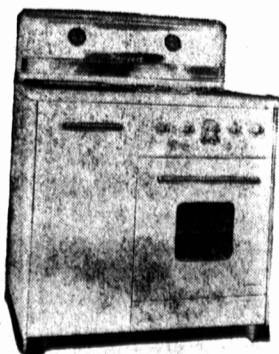

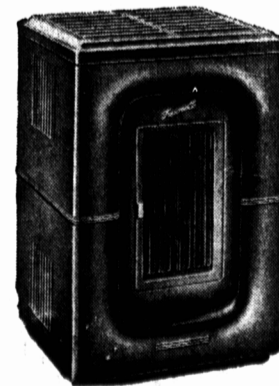

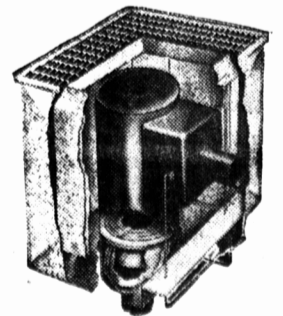
Model 200—Combination Range
