**P.E.I. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE**  
**NOTICE TO WATER TAKERS**  
**OF CHARLOTTETOWN**

Because of the great amount of water wasting which could seriously threaten the water supply, the Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply for the City of Charlottetown have instituted a survey of causes of wastage including faulty fixtures, unnecessary leakage and illegal use of water.

For the benefit of the public, we are quoting below by-laws and regulations of the Water Department.

**BY-LAWS AND REGULATIONS**  
 The following by-laws and regulations shall be considered a part of the contract with every person who uses the water, and the fact of using it shall be considered as expressing assent on the part of the user to be bound thereby:

1. All applications for service pipe and the use of water must be made at the office of the Water Commissioners on or before Saturday, February 23, 1963.

2. All bills for water shall be payable at the office of the Water Commissioners quarterly in advance, on the first days of January, April, July and October. If not paid within the time specified, the water will be shut off and not let on again, except on payment of one dollar (\$1) in addition to the rates due.

3. All persons using water must keep the water pipes and fixtures within their premises in good repair and protected from frost, at their own expense.

4. Water-takers shall prevent all unnecessary waste, and water shall be left running to prevent freezing. There shall be no concealment of the purposes for which water is used.

5. Any person supplied with water shall not allow another to take water from their fixtures without the written permission of the Water Commissioners.

6. No increase or extension of fixtures shall be made without written permission from the Board, and no master or journeyman plumber shall add any such extensions without first securing said permission.

7. The suitability of all fixtures, plumbing and piping will be subject to the approval of the proper officers of the Board.

8. Water-takers violating any of the by-laws of the Water Commissioners shall be liable to have their supply of water shut off until the cause of offence is removed and the payment of \$1.00 is made.

9. Any person who shall violate number one, six, seven, eight, nine, twelve or thirteen of the foregoing by-laws, upon conviction before a Justice of the Peace, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten (\$10) dollars, to be recovered by and paid to the Water Commissioners, for Water Works purposes, in default of payment to be imprisoned in the jail of this county for a term not exceeding ten days.
