Seed Capital ConneXion Program Financing for Young Entrepreneurs

The Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency (ACOA), in partnership with providers such as the UPEI School of Business, is committed to helping young Atlantic Canadians acquire the skills needed to prosper. We address some of the biggest obstacles facing young entrepreneurs, such as business information and access to financing.

The program provides Atlantic Canadians between the ages of 18 and 29 access to a repayable, unsecured personal loan up to \$15,000 for business start-up, expansion or modernization. There is up to \$2,000 available to clients for specialized business training or counselling, paid by ACOA.

The applicant, or applicants, must own a majority of the intended business and must complete a viable business plan outlining the opportunity.

An approved loan may be used as equity to attract other investors but cannot be used for refinancing of existing business debts or business restructuring. Seed ConneXion loans are intended as long-term investments in the financing of the business.

The intent of the program is to have a full-time commitment to the business. For this reason, full time students would not normally be eligible.

Since 1997, our the UPEI School of Business Seed Capital Office has received 129 applications, approved 59 new ventures, and advanced loans totalling \$624,450.
