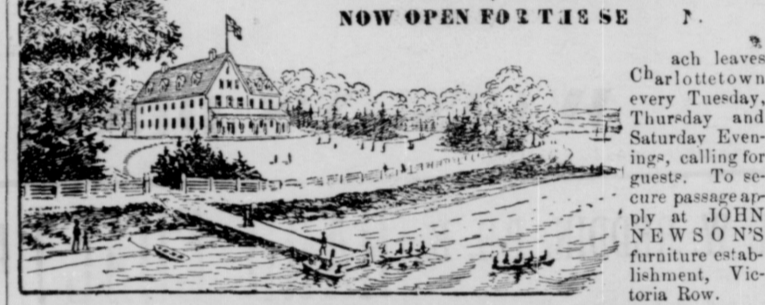

MR. MACLAREN'S SUGGESTIONS.

"Things That Tend to Injure the Flavor of Cheese."

The following letter from A. F. MacLaren is reprinted from the Woodstock, Ont., Sentinel-Review:

Mr. Editor,—As I am under the weather and not overjoyed with my roof, and feel that I am from the effects of a severe cold contracted five weeks ago, I thought it might be a good time to try to do some good along the line of improving the quality of cheese by telling you of things I have seen in connection with and around cheese factories, which I consider are a great injury to flavor in cheese.

Now, what I am about to find the greatest fault in cheese is that it is not kept close to the factory. I may say that I visited over forty factories last week, and I consider at least, ten of them were injuring the flavor of their cheese purely and simply by hog flavor from the pig pens. Strange to say, the factory people become so accustomed to this that they do not seem to mind or notice it. But the milk and curd which is being made into cheese, so surely as these are there becomes contaminated and the sooner the health officers in the different localities insist on this line of business being improved on, so much the better for every patron of a cheese factory. Take two cups cornmeal, two cups flour, two cups milk, one cup sugar, one-half cup molasses, one-half cup of sugar, two even teaspoonfuls of soda, one teaspoonful of salt. Heat this.

A Toilet Hint. It should be soaked quickly in alum water or ice water and lemon juice; then into the boiling syrup and cooked slowly until clear.

Little holders for lifting the 5 o'clock tea kettle, the chafing dish or the heated handle of a coffee pot at the table are of silver or new silk, lined with felt or of some other soft material, and are fastened to the handle by crossing the silver side through the centre and diagonally with a metal ring of gold or silver. Sometimes the ribbon has a row of buttons, with its insertion on each side.—Evening World.

Most Powerful Vessel Afloat. The British cruiser Terrible, recently launched on the Clyde, is the most powerful vessel in the world. The length of the great war vessel is over 453 meters, or 1487 feet, and her beam is 43 feet 4 inches. The displacement is 14,250 tons, being an enormous increase on the Hellenic or the Blake, the largest vessels of this type in this country navy. The Terrible has no belt of side armor, as in previous men-of-war, the machinery and magazines being protected by a steel arched deck of great strength. The top of this arch is 21 feet above the water line, while the edges are 7 feet below the sides of the vessel. The engine is a triple expansion, and indicates 25,000 horsepower, and will develop a speed of 22 knots. The vessel is a new departure in war ship construction, being built on the lines of the large Atlantic liners.

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COLD STORAGE OF CHEESE.

The Liverpool Daily Post, under date of July 17, says: Last week we announced that Prof. Robertson of Canada, having supervised the construction of a refrigerator room on the Allan liner Mongolian, the first shipment in the cold chamber was made from Montreal on the 29th ult. A large line of cheese received by J. W. Hill into his cold store, William Street, Montreal, on the 22nd June, was placed by the firm of J. C. & G. D. Warrington at the disposal of Prof. Robertson, and after his inspection of condition and quality, was conveyed on board within the space reserved in the Government refrigerator room. The cheese was consigned to John T. Warrington of Button street, Whitechapel, Liverpool, and the news of its condition on arrival here was being anxiously awaited in Canada amongst those engaged in the industry there of which Professor Robertson is the leading exponent. Since the arrival in Liverpool we have had an opportunity of inspecting the cheese thus shipped. The consignees express themselves as highly satisfied with the outcome of the experiment. The cheese, which in all respects upwards of 800 boxes, has been warehoused in the Button stores in the very pink of condition. The paramount object in shipping cheese hitherto has been to obtain as great an immunity as possible from sweating of the article. Not only does the cheese itself become impoverished in quality by "sweating," but foreign flavors are imparted by the presence of other cargo in the hold of the vessel. The new experimental process adopted by Professor Robertson in the instance under notice not only prevents "sweating" by reason of the refrigerating resort to, but also by isolation absolutely secures the possibility of any foreign flavor being contracted. The whole of the boxes of cheese received by Mr Warrington are quite free from sweating marks and as fresh as when first taken on board the Mongolian. Hence it is not at all improbable that Prof. Robertson's method as applied to cheese if not prohibitive in point of cost, will at no distant time find universal acceptance.
