

EPITAPH SPARKS CHURCH ORDER

LONDON (AP)—A 75-year-old widow has been ordered by a Church of England court to remove the words "Forever in My Thoughts" from her husband's tombstone.

Crying, Mrs. Dorothy Maude Wilkinson said: "I thought the inscription suitable. My husband meant everything to me. The words 'Forever in My Thoughts' are quite true. I can't afford to remove it, as I have only got a pension coming in."

The vicar of St. Mary's Church in suburban Ealing, Rev. D. S. Richardson, told the court:

"In these days of paganization of burial, it is necessary for the church to take a strong Christian line. We believe that strong expressions of affection or grief are inappropriate."

The church court on Saturday ordered the words removed from the stone in the churchyard. Within three months or else the church would remove them and bill Mrs. Wilkinson.

First Canadian Is Appointed To Yeoman Warders

LONDON (CP)—The first Canadian to be appointed to the historic Yeomen of the Guards will don his Tudor-style uniform in the Tower of London Jan. 1.

"It's a very great honor to be chosen," said Toronto-born Bruce Knapp in an interview Monday. "This is one of the most sought-after posts in the British army."

Knapp, 44, joined the British army when he was 18 and fought throughout the Second World War. He retired in 1960 to become a salesman but now is returning to uniform.

"I'm taking a huge pay cut," he said, "but it's well worth it."

The Yeomen Warders who guard the Tower of London and the Crown Jewels were instituted by Henry VIII as royal bodyguards. Now the 38 men have an added unofficial duty—guiding tourists around the ancient stone corridors of the tower.

On state occasions Knapp will wear a brilliant gold and scarlet tunic with intricate designs, a cap with a band of red and white flowers, a sword, silver-buckled shoes and what he describes as "a sort of oversize pair of red bloomers" gathered at the knees.

His ordinary uniform will be cut in the same style, but less extravagant.

Red Party In U.S. Gets Stiff Fine

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Communist party in the United States was convicted Monday of failing to register as an agent of the Soviet Union and was fined \$120,000.

U.S. District Judge Alexander Holtzoff imposed the maximum penalty immediately after a jury of eight women and four men returned a verdict of guilty following 35 minutes deliberation.

John J. Abt and Joseph Forer, co-counsel for the Communist party, said they would file an appeal.

The jury found the party guilty on all 12 counts of the indictment.

Eleven counts charged the party with failing to register under the Subversive Activities Control Act on each of 11 days from Nov. 20 to Nov. 30, 1961.

FAILED TO FILE
The 12th count charged the party with failing to file a registration statement listing information about its leaders, members and finances.

The defense had contended that the party did not supply the information because to do so might incriminate its leaders and its members. The U.S. Court of Appeals rejected the party against doing this, the defense argued.

But Judge Holtzoff, in discussing the Fifth Amendment, told the jury: "These are matters that do not concern you. These are irrelevant to the case."

He said only a person, not an organization, can invoke the protection of the Fifth Amendment.

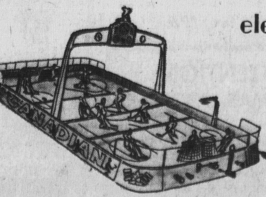
