An international plan to hatch a breeding flock of whooping cranes with eggs gathered from the birds' summer nesting area in the Northwest Territories is being announced by the sources' Minister Ian.

St. John's Residents Hope Mediator May Settle Strike

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—This city of 91,000 is keeping its fingers crossed that a federal labor mediator may be able to do something about the strike of New Orleans dockworkers that has tied up the port for 21 days.

The question in dispute involves which side has control over assignment of stevedores on the ships. The shippers want the stevedores to be assigned to the ships, but the union says it would be a retrogressive step.

He knew that if he won the ten of hearts with the jack, West upon taking the ace of diamonds, would shift to a club at the heart of beating the contract. There could be no future in a heart contract, knowing that South had the suit triply stopped.
