Vandalism Is Reported

SUDBURY (CP) — Outbreaks of vandalism were reported recently at an International Nickel Co. of Canada mine in the third day of a wildcat strike by 16,000 hourly-paid employees.

A spokesman for Local 6500 of the United Steelworkers of America (U.S.W.), the union representing the workers, said management and a bargaining unit will meet today in Toronto with a conciliation officer to discuss workers' grievances.

Earlier Sunday, a few families were evacuated from Inco's Creag Hill Mine after power and water services were cut off during the night by unknown persons. Police are investigating.

The incident was the latest in the tense strike situation. Police said Friday night pickets at the Murray Mine overturned a truck and rolled it down a hillside.

In another incident, an unidentified man was beaten up and a late model car was sprayed with red paint at the Murray site Thursday. Elton Turcotte, 29, of Azilda, was stabbed at Inco's LeVack site.

The strike started Thursday morning when more than 200 Steelworkers walked off the job at the LeVack mine, 35 miles northwest of here. The strike spread to the company's iron ore recovery plant in nearby Waters Township and by evening, almost 90 per cent of Inco's operations were idle.

Union spokesmen said the walkout at LeVack was sparked by a shift boss who ordered several miners to surface after they opened their lunch boxes underground to eat sandwiches before beginning work.

Soviet Visit Is Big Success

MOSCOW (Reuters) — Dmitri Polyansky first vice-chairman of the Soviet council of ministers, says a two-week visit to Canada by a Soviet parliamentary delegation, which he led, was a success.

He said in an interview published in Izvestia Saturday that the delegation "was given a warm welcome both by members of the government and Parliament, and by the ordinary Canadians we met," the Soviet news agency Tass reported.

"We now understand better many aspects of the life of the Canadians and the problems before them," Polyansky said.

Concerning his talks with Canadian leaders, Polyansky said: "Quite naturally, our countries have different approaches to the events in the world. Nevertheless, this exchange of opinions was unquestionably useful. It ensured a correct understanding of our respective positions."

He said "there are big prospects for the development of all-round mutually profitable relations between the U.S.S.R. and Canada."

"Our countries have many problems in common, and there are requisites for fruitful co-operation in the fields of trade, science and technology, and extension of cultural relations."
