TORONTO (CP) - Western oils recorded a moderately steep decline Monday but the rest of the stock market was irregular in trading, which turned sluggish near the close.

The western oil index lost 1 1/2 points, its fifth straight decline. A long list of losses was sprinkled with the odd five or 10-cent gain in the section.

Observers said the decline was not a result of any new reports but rather the same factors which have kept oils from running forward with the rest of the market for months - no markets for western oil and the current ban of export of natural gas.

Individual losses among oils ranged to 30 cents - by Bailey Selburn at \$7.35 - among the lower-priced stocks and to nearly 1/2 point among the senior stocks.
