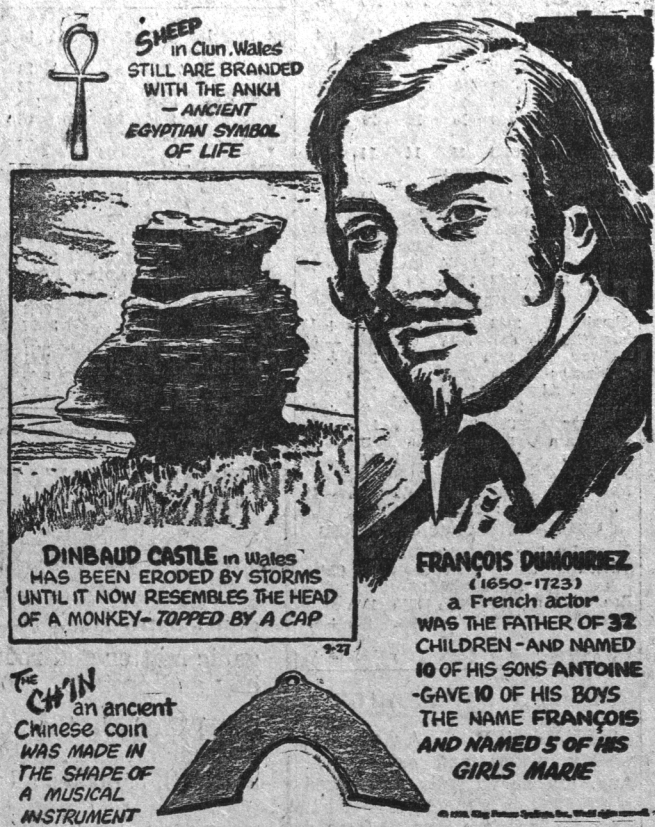


RIPLEY'S BELIEVE IT OR NOT

South dealer.
Both sides vulnerable.

NORTH
♠ A J 10 7 5 2
♥ 5
♦ 4 2

EAST
♠ 9 8

SOUTH
♠ A K Q

The bidding:
South West North East
1♣ Pass 1♠ Pass
3NT

Opening lead—ten of hearts. Some hands lend themselves much more readily to error than others. The reason usually is that the gimmick, if there is one, lies concealed beneath the surface. West opens a heart and South wins with the ace. The hand looks like a cinch to make, so declarer starts to run his diamonds. He leads the ace and then the king, but when West shows out, South finds he's in trouble. What looked like nine or ten easy tricks all of a sudden changes to only eight tricks. And what is worse, South can't do anything about it. He winds up taking eight tricks for down one.

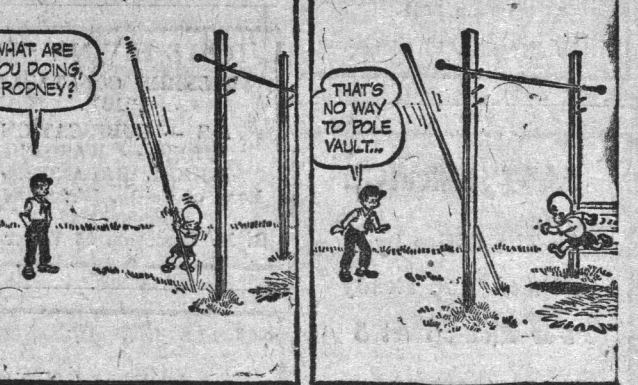

Red Purge In Hungary Seen

VIENNA (Reuters)—Hungarian Communist chief Janos Kadar is engaged in a fierce struggle to retain power, reports reaching here said Saturday night. These reports say Hungary is likely to see a major purge as a result of the struggle. The purge probably will follow Hungarian elections expected late in November. Informed quarters in Budapest said little change is anticipated from the elections themselves but reports reaching Vienna said a major house-cleaning will follow. Among those ticketed for demotion are President Istvan Dobi and National Assembly President Sandor Ronai. Kadar himself is being challenged by other members of the ruling party praesidium.
