

West Prince Trade Board Addressed On Fish Products

ALBERTON A meeting of the West Prince Trade Board of Trade last night was devoted entirely to a highly interesting address by Abner D. DeWalt, technical officer with the federal department of fisheries inspection service.

One of his chief duties is the inspection of all imported specialty fish products brought into Eastern Canada. Over 9,000,000 pounds was imported last year from 30 countries. Mr. DeWalt told the board, consisting mainly of high quality items such as herring fillets in Brigan's dry sauce, skinless herring fillets, cod fish cuttings in L.M.O., dried and smoked salmon and other specialty products.

Some of these could very well be produced in the Maritimes, he stated, but they would have to be of high quality with good workmanship, correct labelling and packaging in order to compete in the world market.

Samples of products from Germany, Sweden, Norway, Iceland and the United States were shown from France, Germany, Sweden, Norway, Iceland and the United States.

Those at the meeting were impressed with the attractive packaging, labelling and the variety of ways in which herring was used in the specialty products which command a high price. Some of the tins were opened and samples passed around to the members on the board.

"Fishermen and packers must realize that we have to compete with fish exporting countries all over the world," Mr. DeWalt said, "and must therefore maintain a high standard."

Mr. DeWalt was accompanied by Richard Doyle, fish technical officer from the department of fisheries in Charlottetown and R.D. McKinnon, fishery inspector at Alberton. Appreciation was expressed by the board.

The meeting was chaired by Don Campbell and the guest speaker was introduced by C.R. Leard.

The bill was introduced by Mr. Russell DeLoach (PC-3rd Queens). The diocese corporation may also pledge or charge any or all of its real or personal property to secure the fulfillment of any guarantee it enters into under the authority of its incorporation act.
