EXPORTS OF AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS

The trade returns for 1893 give the following exports of farm produce:

Table with 3 columns: Product, 1892, 1893. Includes items like Cheese, Butter, Hides, Bacon, Meats, Wool, Beans, Oats, Wheat, Flour, Hay, Potatoes.

This is on the basis of values in a year during which prices ruled low. If taken on the basis of the quantities exported, the showing would be much better.

A feature of this branch of our foreign commerce is the expansion of the British market in many lines, such as the following:

This marked increase does not rest on these detailed articles alone. Taking agricultural produce as a whole, our exports to Britain have risen in this ratio:

EXPORTS OF MANUFACTURES

The total value of exported Canadian manufactures in 1892 was \$7,740,000; in 1893, \$8,497,000.

The fact that, besides giving employment to thousands of men, creating a home market for so much more farm produce and largely supplying the home demand for goods at unprecedentedly low prices, the factories of Canada were able last year to export goods to the value of eight and a half millions of dollars seems to indicate that the N. P. is still doing its good work.
