

Consider Seats Facing Rear In Passenger Planes

MONTREAL (CP)—The use of seats facing rear in passenger aircraft will be discussed at a 20-country aviation conference beginning today.

The International Civil Aviation Organization said rear-facing seats will be among topics to be discussed at the air navigation conference dealing with problems involving the airworthiness and operation of aircraft.

The conference will be held at ICAO headquarters and is expected to last up to five weeks. The use of specially-stressed rear-facing seats for transport aeroplanes has been suggested as a method of reducing the danger of injury to passengers in case of accident. An ICAO statement said:

FITTED IN MILITARY CRAFT

"During the past few years several countries have fitted their military aircraft with these seats, and experience with them now is available to the conference."

Increasing speeds and traffic density also make it necessary for the conference to take "a new look" at the problem of aircraft navigation lights.

The experts will renew their studies on how to avoid mid-air collisions in murky weather and at night.

"Included in the discussions of navigation lights will be high-intensity flashing 'anti-collision light,' and the degree of international standardization these lights should be given."

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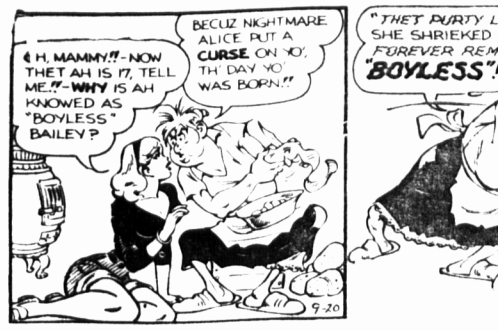

(Top Record-Holder in Masters' Individual Championship Play)

North dealer. Both sides vulnerable.

The bidding:
North East South West

Opening lead—seven of diamonds.

The most significant bid in the sequence shown, and the one which induced South to contract for slam, was North's four heart bid. This bid, joined with North's previous bid, three spades, made it apparent that North had extra values.

If North had had a minimum opening bid he would presumably have chosen to bid three hearts over two spades rather than make the more encouraging and constructive bid of three spades. Hence, North must have bypassed the early opportunity to rebid hearts for the sake of inducing a game contract.

Question Of Drew's Health Is Fast Becoming National Issue

OTTAWA (CP)—Health may play a major role in the federal election campaign expected next year. And in some ways it may parallel this fall's United States presidential battle—but in reverse.

In the U. S., the health of President Eisenhower comes under the voter's scrutiny. In Canada, the physical condition of Opposition leader Drew may be the poser for the electorate.

The question of Mr. Drew's health arose anew last week with word that the 62-year-old Progressive Conservative leader was back in hospital for his second "rest" in just a few weeks.

So far there has been no official questioning of Mr. Drew's ability to lead the party in another election campaign. But privately, party informants say there is concern.

Speculation on his future apparently led to a party headquarters statement last week saying Mr. Drew entered hospital only because he could not get enough privacy in Bermuda.

RUMORS RAMPANT

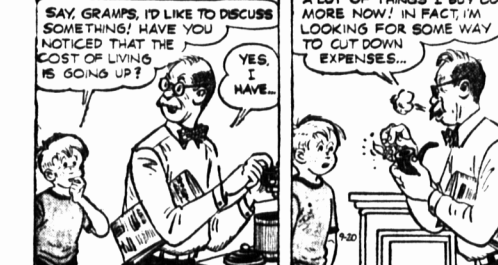
A variety of rumors developed. In some quarters there was talk that a meeting of the party's national council would be called. There also were reports that Drew would soon resign and that Premier St. Laurent would call on Mr. Drew to succeed him.

Mr. Drew took off for Bermuda to continue his vacation; but on Sept. 9, two weeks earlier than planned, he returned to Canada to again enter hospital, this time the Wellesley in Toronto.
