**ARMY REUNION DINNER PLANNED**  
TORONTO (CP)—Exercise Elbow II, a reunion dinner for the Second World War officers of the Canadian Army, is scheduled for next May 3 in Toronto.  
Elbow II was held here during 1952, 700 wartime officers from across Canada attending.  
Arranging the get-together is a committee headed by Maj. - Gen. Churchill Mann, wartime chief of staff at 1st Canadian Army headquarters. Lt. - Col. Ernest W. Whelpton of 364 Richmond St. W., Toronto, as a voluntary secretary is working to bring up to date his five-year-old address list.

## BUSINESS FAILURES UP

OTTAWA (CP)—Business failures in Canada in the first half of 1956 increased nearly 1 per cent over the corresponding period last year, the bureau of statistics said Monday. A total of 3,406 commercial concerns went out of business under provisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Act, compared with 1,236 a year earlier. Their defaulted liabilities increased 10 per cent to \$2,814,000 from last year's \$2,522,000.

## ROYAL WINTER FAIR

The 34th Royal Agricultural Winter Fair at Toronto is being held this year November 9 to 17. The Fair is divided into six main divisions namely: 1. Horse Show, 2. Live Stock, 3. Dairy Products, 4. Flowers, Fruit, Honey and Maple products, Poultry Products, 5. Tropical Fish, Vegetables, 6. Poultry, Pigeons, Rabbits, Cavies, Cage Birds, and Mink, 7. Seed, Grain and Hay, 8. Junior Activities.

Prince Edward Island will be well represented with over ninety exhibitors. In the livestock divisions there are seven showing cattle and one showing Mink. One exhibitor each of barley and oats. In the Potato Classes there are eighty-five exhibitors, this includes both seed and table stock potatoes.

The dairy cattle will be shown on Monday and Tuesday November 12 and 13. The beef cattle all breeds except Red Poll, on Thursday 15 and Friday 16. The Red Polls on Saturday, November 10. The Yorkshires breeding classes Monday November 12.

The farm of A. MacRae and Son, one of the Province's most outstanding Ayrshire herds, will be showing ten head. Included in the show head is the Provincial Exhibition Champion Bull, the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Cow. To Major and Arthur MacRae, go our congratulations for a job well done and best wishes at this year's Royal.

The famous North River Jersey herd of Edson B. Mutch will also compete with eleven head. During the last two Royal Fairs Mutch has won the Grand Champion Bull. This is an outstanding accomplishment for one breeder to win two Grands in a row on two different animals.

Also in the Jersey classes will be exhibited by Fred Kilson, Hunter River, two head; James Vick and Francis Morrison, St. Peter's Bay, two head.

B. B. Jones, owner and manager of Bunbury Farms, will be showing one animal Abegweit Ovation born in July 1955. Junior Champion and Reserve Junior Champion at the Provincial Exhibition. At the time of the show, Professor Rathby said in his opinion that this animal was one of the most outstanding on the grounds. A sample of Chagritetown 80 Barley, taken from the same lot which won the Championship at the Provincial Harvest Exhibition, will be shown by Mr. Jones. Also in the Mink division he has five entries.

R. E. White and Son of Hunter River, who won the Championship at the Provincial Harvest Exhibition on his Abegweit out, will be competing with the same variety at this year's Royal.

Dingwall MacLeod, of Vernon, who won the Trophy two years ago, will again be competing with two entries of dressed poultry.
