Winnipeg Employers Tap Rich Labor Pool In Britain

WINNIPEG (CP) - Hard-pressed Winnipeg employers are tapping the rich British labor pool for the skilled workmen they can't find at home.

Four Winnipeg employers, all requiring highly-skilled workmen, returned recently from a recruiting tour with at least 130 new employees and some are going back for more.

They agree that the United Kingdom holds the most fertile employee hunting ground they have uncovered in the search

to bolster their skilled-worker ranks.

And, a recent British government decision to freeze wages has made the workers more receptive to Manitoba offers.

A. J. Thiessen, president of Western Flyer Coach Co. Ltd., had 300 replies to his advertisement for workers. He hired 24 of the 35 he interviewed including two professional engineers.

FOUND EMPLOYEES

Milton Pogson of Manitoba Rolling Mills had a similar experience during a five-week recruiting trip. He found 80 new employees for the Manitoba steel firm including professional engineers, structural draftsmen, boiler makers and fitters.

F. L. Hinings of Bristol Aerospace Ltd., attracted about a dozen, he says, and the firm hopes to lure another 30 to 40 in a second trip this fall to fill employment requirements for next year.

Mr. Thiessen said some of the tradesmen "are not too skilled by British standards but they certainly are by ours."

Joe Malko, director of the province's immigration branch, says Manitoba has an edge over other provinces in attracting workers. The province agrees to write off the immigrant's transportation loan-acquired interest-free from the federal government - over a three-year period provided he stays in the province.

Mr. Malko, who recently surveyed the potential of employee markets in European countries, also suggests that Manitoba businessmen look to Holland for workers.

Canada and its citizens are held in high regard in that country, assisting employers trying to break the ice in obtaining workers.

He also says the government plans to survey Scotland for garment workers to close the Manitoba gap where an estimated 3,000 workers are required.

Name Plate Is Changed

OTTAWA (CP) - The name plate on the Sir John Thompson federal building in Halifax has been changed to give precedence to the English language, says a public works department official.

Previously, the French language was above the English on the name plate but this was an error.

This was one of four such errors that had occurred this year. The others involved Edmonton's new postal station, the federal building in Port Hope, Ont., and the post office in Streetsville, Ont.

The official said the policy of the works department is that the predominant language of the area will be given first place.

The department expects it will be necessary to make changes on other signs, he said, without specifying locales.

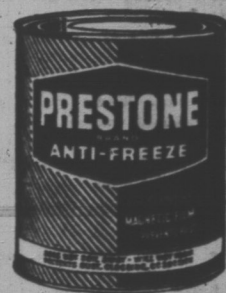
