***PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH**

Inquest Ordered In Georgetown Royalty Death

Alexander MacLellan, 42, of De Gros Marsh, was found dead yesterday at the home of John Dan Morrison, Georgetown Royalty. Coroner Dr. A. Kennedy of Georgetown impanelled a jury and after viewing the body, the hearing was adjourned until Feb. 19. It will open at 2 p. m. in the Council Chamber at Georgetown. MacLellan, a veteran of the Second Great War, had arrived at the home of Mr. Morrison about 9 o'clock Saturday night. He was still there when Mr. Morrison, a bachelor, retired for the night about midnight. Earlier he had removed MacLellan's rubber boots. MacLellan was left sitting on a couch in a bent over position. Sunday Mr. Morrison slept late, and it was not until noon that he found MacLellan dead, in about the same position as he left him the previous night, he told police.

The Montague R. C. M. P. detachment and the Coroner at Georgetown were informed of the death. It was reported Mr. MacLellan and his brother, Joseph MacLellan of Newport had been in Georgetown Saturday morning. They returned to Joseph's home for dinner and then the deceased had left, en route, it was presumed, to his own home. His movements from then until he arrived at the Morrison home were not known immediately. He was not married. The deceased had returned home from hospital in Charlottetown about two weeks ago. He had been receiving treatment for a stomach ailment. The body was taken to Charlottetown yesterday where an autopsy will be performed by the Provincial Pathologist. 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400-Ship Armada Is Ready For Immediate Action



A QUICK REPLY to would-be aggressors by the British is a reserve fleet of over 400 vessels, from battleships to small craft, which, under a three-year program now nearing completion, lies in home and overseas ports ready for short-notice action. No collection of rotting hulks, but an up-to-date, completely refitted and equipped fighting force merely needing unspinning, it has a vice-admiral and a staff assigned to it, its stores indexed so that unfamiliar crews can take over immediately, and warm air being pumped through the fire mains of some of its vessels.
