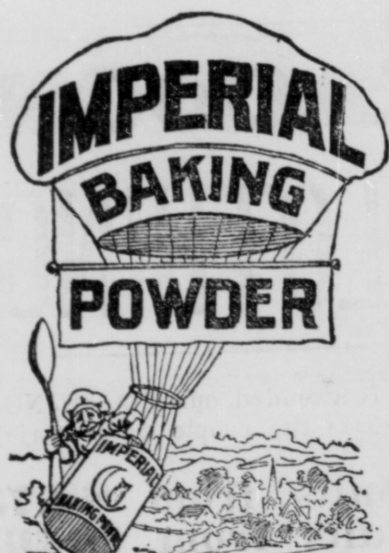


Will Asiatic Cholera Follow?

The Telephone Company OF P. E. ISLAND.

PARTIES using the Telephones would find would observe the following rules: 1st. Speak with the mouth about four inches from the transmitter.

2nd. Speak in a moderate tone of voice, not too loud, and distinctly.

3rd. Place the telephone so as to cover the ear, just as if you wished to shut out all other sounds. Do not press too hard on the ear.

It is possible to talk and be heard when standing back two or three feet from the transmitter, and in a useless waste of wind and lungs, besides being very annoying to all within range of your voice.
