

Bedeque Area Reports Worm Infestation

at least 15 acres of grain near Bedeque have been attacked by army worms, and several other reports of infestation have come in from Georgetown, White Sands, and Giguery Cove areas.

Earlier this week army worms had been reported in fields in the Albany Plains and New Perth districts. A department of agriculture spokesman said yesterday that they had been spraying grainfields and doing damage in all provinces east from Ontario.

Infested fields should be sprayed with a solution of water and Malathion, one quart of the chemical to the acre, according to the agriculture department.

The department says that the entire grain plant should be sprayed as army worms lie on the ground during the day and feed on grain plants at night. Effects of Malathion are lost after three or four days so the chemical is not harmful to feeding livestock, after this time.

Jury Members Are Named In Murphy Death Inquest

An inquest has been ordered by Coroner Dr. L. E. Prowse following the death of Albert Murphy, 34, at the Albert McCarver and dipton, in a two-car head-on collision near DeSable Thursday morning.

Eight other people injured in the accident are still in hospital, some of them seriously injured, though most are of the critical list on which they were placed following admission to hospital.

Date for the inquest has been set for October 12 because of the serious condition of some of the injured.

Robert Mulligan, both of Kiskora, McCarver's condition is described as slightly improved since admission with head injuries. Mulligan is suffering from leg injuries.
