PETER DANIEL MACDONALD
 The community of Milltown Cross was shocked on Nov. 17th, 1959 to hear of the sudden passing of Peter Daniel Macdonald from a heart attack.
 Mr. Macdonald was born in Souris, March 22nd, 1881, son of the late Alfred and Elizabeth (Stewart) Macdonald.
 He spent most of his life in the U.S.A. and was Inspector of United Electric Railway Company, for many years in Providence, R.I. Mr. Macdonald retired in 1946 and made his home in Milltown Cross until his death.
 He was a member of the Methodist Church in Providence and later joined the Presbyterian church in Montague. When unable to attend church he enjoyed the sermons on the radio especially "The Family Bible Hour."
