NEW YORK (AP) - Blue-chip strength gave the stock market a rise Monday, despite some news of discouraging news. Trading was moderate.
The Dow Jones industrial average advanced 7.18 to 779.83, backing away from its best gain of 10.41, made at noon.
Wall Street analysts thought there might be some selling because of the September drop in industrial production, cost-cutting by Chrysler, labor stoppages at General Electric and a published report that steel buying appears to be heading into a gradual slide.
Instead of falling, however, the market rose from the opening.
American Telephone was the most active issue, rising 1 1/2 to 55 1/2 on 100,200 shares.
AP AVERAGE RISES
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 2.9 to 282.2. Thirteen of the 15 most active stocks rose and two fell.
Hertz, reported to have agreed in principle to a merger with RCA, was active and up 5 1/2 to 89 1/4. RCA rose 1 1/2 to 42 1/4.
Canadian Pacific gained a point to lead Canadian issues. Walker Gooderham was up 3/4. Alcan, Dome Mines and Hudson Bay Mining 1/4 each. International Nickel declined 1/4.




TORONTO (CP) - The Toronto stock market rolled up another sharp gain Monday as the industrial index scored its biggest daily advance in 14 months.
The index, an indicator of how key stocks move, jumped 1.50 to 142.25. Earlier it had climbed 1.75. Its highest since Aug. 13, 1965.
It was the fifth consecutive daily advance for the market.
Royal Bank paced the main list, moving up 1 1/2 to 68 1/2. CPR added 1 1/2 at 56 1/2, Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce 1 1/2 at 56 1/2 and Alcan 3/4 at 28 1/2. International Minerals dropped 3 to 52.
Lake Duffall, which announced encircling copper and zinc findings on its Noranda, Que., property, gained 1.85 to 10 1/2 in base-metal activity.
URANIUMS ADVANCE
Uraniums also fared well with Rio Algom ahead 1/2 to 23 1/4 and Alcan 1/2 to 59 after rising 3 Friday.
United Keno Hill, Canada's largest silver mine, tumbled 1.05 to a low of 3.55 on news that the company might have to close its Yukon mine.
Canadian Superior highlighted western oils as it gained 1 1/2 to 24.
Frobex and Area, which are jointly drilling on the Gaspe property of Westford mines, continued to highlight speculative interest. Frobex was up 15 cents to 3.60 and Area 5 cents to 3.50.
On index, golds were ahead 35 to 157.32, base metals .85 to 87.74, western oils 1.32 to 106.90 and the TSE 1.42 to 136.24. Volume was 3,187,000 shares compared with 2,770,000 Friday.




