Contract Bridge

GEARING THE BIDDING TO THE PLAY

There is one generally concerning bidding, the logic of which should require no argument. It is simply this: Do whatever "pushing" you are inclined to do only when the about-to-be declarer-partner or yourself - has the skill to exploit every opportunity that may be present!

Take the following deal for example. North unquestionably bid one trick more than he should have - but if his partner had been a finer player, this optimism would have produced a substantial extra profit.

North dealer, North-South vulnerable.

As previously implied, North might well have been satisfied with a six-heart contract! West opened the diamond jack. Declarer quickly drew the necessary three rounds of trumps, led to the spade ace and discarded his own two spade losers on the high diamonds, then hopefully tried out the club situation. But the break of the club suit proved an insurmountable obstacle at this point, and the grand-slam contract was down one.

Success with this contract was simply a matter of avoiding optical illusion! The moment trumps were found to break 3-2, 13 tricks were easily available except in the unlikely event of a 4-0 break of the missing club! It was declarer's choice of discards on the diamonds that defeated him. After drawing trumps, the best line of play, by far, was to cash the King and ace of clubs, then to discard South's remaining clubs on the high diamonds. Now a club ruff would establish two long cards in the suit in dummy, and declarer could use these very tidily for the discard of his own losing spades.
