

A Woman's Terrible Curse.

Only a small proportion of interesting occurrences gets into the papers, and of those that are reported the half is usually not told. New York journals gave a few lines to the fact that the mother of Jimmie Elliot, the prize fighter, who was killed by Dunn in Chicago, sent back to Harry Hill a contribution of \$60, because her son's death had been indirectly caused by a quarrel with him. But the curse that she pronounced on Dunn was left on the note-book of the stenographer who heard it. It was spoken partly in the Irish language, but being interpreted ran as follows: "May heaven send him bad luck and give him a strong constitution to bear it. May he look at good fortune constantly before him and never overtake it. May fire and flood pursue him wherever he goes. May the walls of prisons, poor-houses, and mad-houses alone shelter him. May deformity of mind and body follow his children and grandchildren. May his sons be led to disgrace and crime, and may the borean dhuw (the dark pathway) of the informer be their only escape from the hangman. May his daughters go to shame. May he bring misfortune on all who try to befriend him. May the last of his race die like a dog in the service of the red enemy of Ireland." The furious utterance of this invective, and the rugged Irish in which it was expressed, was in keeping with the heartfelt damnation which it invoked.

A Tragic Wedding.

A bridal experience almost surpassing in tragic horror that of the bride of Lammormoor, which Scott said was "an over true tale," is reported from Rio Grande del Sur, near the Uruguay frontier. A young farmer's marriage was postponed on account of his being bitten by a dog. The wound was cauterized and all went well. Three months later the doctors declared all danger over. The marriage took place. A supper followed, and at supper the bridegroom was noticed to fall into gloomy abstraction. After supper came dancing, and when the ball was at its height the bride and bridegroom withdrew. About an hour later piercing screams came from the bridal chamber. The door was burst open. On the floor lay the bride, still alive, but torn as though by a wild beast. The bridegroom, covered with blood, and foaming at the mouth, cowered in a corner, but in a moment sprang upon one of the men, when a brother of the bride sent a bullet through his brain.

One Dr. Phillips, a London surgeon, has made the discovery that teetotalism means increased eating and drinking. At a coroner's inquest on the 12th inst., on the body of a man of 41, found dead in his room, whose end was ascribed by medical evidence to diseased lungs, and chronic dyspepsia, Dr. Phillips observed that he now found it common for people who suffered with their lungs to be esteemed drunkards. "I suppose," said the coroner, "you are now finding a new condition of things, as teetotalism is becoming so popular?" Dr. Phillips replied: "Oh yes; I find the liver large as a rule, and the stomach much distended, arising from the absorption of a great quantity of fluid. It is of course a fact that teetotallers do absorb much more drink than others, particular effervescent drinks, which have a tendency to distend the stomach, and they also eat much more meat than drinking men, and eat more generally, which will account for the large livers and distended stomachs.
