VICTORIA (CP) — Ham Richardson gave the United States its fourth straight victory over Canada in the North American zone Davis Cup semi-finals Sunday, trimming Bob Bedard of Sherbrooke, Que., 6-4, 6-4, 13-11.

The cup tie had been decided Saturday when the United States took the doubles for its third and clinching match victory in the best-of-five series.

Richardson, the lean Rhodes scholar from Westfield, N. J., trapped Bedard out of position regularly in putting away the first two sets. In the third, however, Bedard was on the threshold of victory in the eighth game—

with score 5-3—when he lost his service.

He kept the pressure on Richardson until he lost his service again in the 22nd game, then Ham closed it out sharply, giving Bedard only one point in the final game.

NEWCOMERS EARN TIE

In the marathon third set, services were broken consistently. Holmberg served to open the set and won his game. The score sawawed from then on. Canada lost the fifth game when Bedard blasted one into the net after forcing deuce three times. That made the score 3-2.

Fontana's service was broken in the eighth game and the U.S. went ahead 5-3. In the next game the tables were turned when Holmberg's service was broken.

Fifth and deciding set of the match was almost routine action. Only break came in the sixth game with the U.S. leading 4-1, when Bedard aced the opposition on one serve and racked up a love game to make the set standings 4-2.
