Impaired Drivers Are Fined \$100

A fine of \$100 and costs was paid Friday by Chester Earl Willock, Souris River, for driving while his abilities were impaired by alcohol. He appeared before Magistrate James B. Johnston, Q.C. in Queens County magistrate's court.
James Angus Macleoin, Tradee Cross, charged with driving while impaired had his case remanded to Oct. 12.
Cecil Earl Willis, Harrington, charged with driving while being disqualified from holding a licence, fined \$100 and costs was paid by Raymond Boswell MacCallum, Marsfield, for driving while impaired.
The case of Donald Ivan MacLean, Charlottetown, charged with driving while impaired, was remanded to Oct. 23.
Samuel Lambert, Moncton, N.B. and David Clinton Andrews, Summerside, both pleaded guilty to speeding charges and each was fined \$15 and costs or five days in jail.
On similar charges, Carl Bertam Willis, Cornwall; Mayo Elmer Bernard, Kensington; and Madeline Theresa Greenan, Emerald, were each fined \$10 and costs or five days.
For driving without due care and attention, Robert Allison Howatt, Crapaud, was fined \$20 and costs or five days, and Raymond Harold Crossman, C.F.A., was fined \$10 and costs or five days.
A fine of \$80 and costs or 10 days, was meted out to Donald James Barlow, Bradshaw, on the charge of driving without an operator's licence. On a similar charge two other accused were each fined \$10 and costs or five days.
Pleading guilty to operating motor vehicles with defective equipment, two accused were each fined \$5 and costs or two days.

Gov't Plans Retirement For Senators

OTTAWA (CP)—The government has in a clear-cut plan for compulsory retirement of senators at age 75.
It gave the Commons formal notice of a measure to provide \$5,000 annual pension for senators retiring at age 75 under the terms of a proposed constitutional amendment to the British North America Act affecting the upper chamber. Senators now receive life appointments at \$10,000 a year.
The pensions would not apply to senators appointed since last April 6.

Murray R. Girl Struck By Car

REDS ACCUSE U.S.

The complaint was made by the official news agency Tass. It denounced the maneuvers as provocations. The Russians have made a number of similar complaints in the last year.
