Tuna fish which congregate along the Nova Scotia shore in summer months are found almost all over the world.

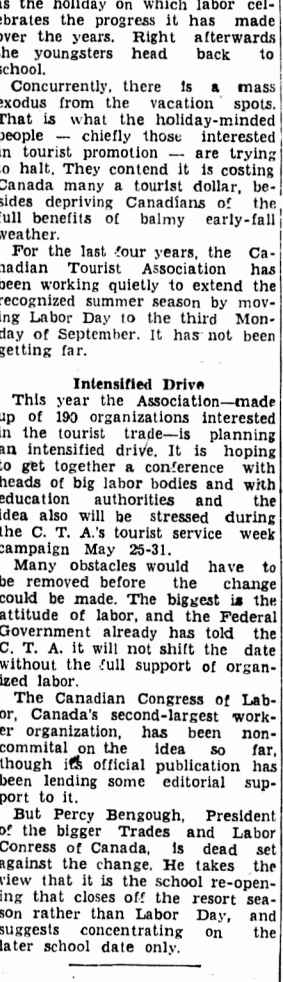
ARMY GEAR POPULAR IN CHILLY KOREA
