STRATHROY, Ont., July 27 —(CP)—Canada lost two citizens every day through drowning in 1948, Health Minister Martin said tonight in an address prepared for delivery at the opening of a service club (Lions) swimming pool here.
He said 724 Canadians drowned during the year, though even this figure was a considerable improvement over previous years.

A muted peal will mark the climax of a memorial service in the Abbey, considered the highest honor Britain can bestow.
Diplomats, representatives of royalty and leading political personalities will attend a 35-minute service presided over by Very Rev. Alan Don, Dean of Westminster.

More Money For Canadian Defences

OTTAWA, July 27—(CP)—The developments in Korea has caused the government to decide to spend "thousands of dollars" in defence in addition to current defence commitments, Defence Minister Claxton said tonight.
The 1950-51 fiscal budget calls for expenditure of \$425,000,000 on defence.
Mr. Claxton said that the cabinet already had "planned" to spend thousands of dollars over and above that amount. He declined to specify the exact additional amount decided upon.

Throws Away Two Diamond Rings

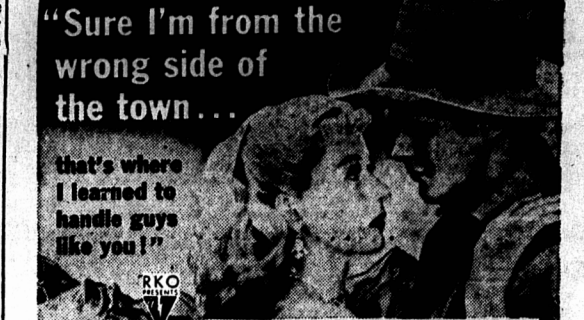
