ENGLAND AND THE TRANSVAAL

How an English Officer Views the Disturbing Questions.

CHICAGO, June 22.—Lord Cecil Douglas Compton, an English captain of Lancers, after a brief stay in Chicago left for the east last night with his wife. Lord Compton served in South Africa for five years. He knows the Boers and their country and has considered both critically from the standpoint of a military officer and student.

He spoke of the Transvaal problem entirely as a military man. He said "There are more motives of fair play and humanity which make Great Britain exceedingly reluctant to interfere in South Africa by force. But it is only candid to say that considerations of a military character also operate to make us chary about rushing into a campaign which must present the most formidable obstacles and involve questions of transport, supply and strategy that might stagger a military expert."

"In the first place the Boers of the Transvaal are magnificent fighters. Their history has proved it and they are fully up to their standard to-day. They are expert marksmen, born rough riders, just as your cowboys, and their courage and tenacity is undeniable. Undoubtedly they are as good military stuff as the world possesses. They also are thoroughly convinced of the justice of their cause and would die to a man at the order of Oom Paul.

But aside from their morals and their fitness, the Transvaal country is one admirably adapted for the purposes of defence. It is inland with large uninhabited spaces. An army inhabiting it must have a distant base and its supplies must be brought up through a semi-tropical country under the most disadvantageous conditions. Cape Town is a thousand miles from the Vaal river, and if an attack were to be made from Natal there would be mountains to work through and much tropical growth.

"The question of transportation would be serious. We would need thousands of mules which must be brought from South America. The ocean distance and the adverse climate will kill animals by thousands, and the actual work would entail even greater loss.

There is a question of strategy as well. The Boers would be difficult to hit in a mass. Indeed, they might not be mobilized in a European sense at all. In arid, rocky country, filled with splendid shots, with no real objective point to capture, with a disaffected or actively hostile population on your flank or rear, the conquest of the Transvaal would be one of the most arduous undertakings we ever entered upon. In my opinion no less than 60,000 would be required. Your own Philippine war is not so difficult."

MONEY TO FORTIFY HALIFAX

Brings Forth an Objection from Michael Davitt.

LONDON, June 21.—When the House of Commons went into committee today on the military works loan bill, the Parliamentary Secretary of the War Office, Mr. George Wyndham, moved a resolution authorizing the introduction of a bill providing a loan of \$2,000,000, repayable in yearly instalments, for defense works, barracks and rifle ranges at home and abroad. He explained that this was merely a continuation of the policy laid down by the Military Works Loan Act of 1897, and pointed out that all British sea-borne commerce converged at a point between Cape Clear and Ushant, necessitating strategic harbours of refuge, all of which must be defended by heavy guns. In this manner and on other works, he explained, it was proposed to spend, \$5,000,000 and on barracks the sum of \$13,000,000 was to be spent, of which sum \$3,375,000 would be expended on the present barracks. The balance would be devoted to the expense of new situations and Wei-Hai-Wei would absorb \$650,000.

Mr. Wyndham's barrack expenditure, mentioned in a previous despatch, includes \$200,000 for Halifax N. S.

Mr. Michael Davitt, Irish Nationalist, opposed Mr. Wyndham's resolution, saying he objected especially to the expenditures at Halifax, Bermuda and Jamaica as being altogether unnecessary. "because at present the Government of Great Britain and the United States are engaged in exchanging diplomatic love messages, yet these proposed guns were pointed at their Anglo-Saxon cousins."

Mr. Davitt said if the Government was sincere in its professions of love and friendship it was acting perfidiously and insincerely in making these fortifications on the Atlantic coast.

The resolution was adopted by a vote of 241 to 66.

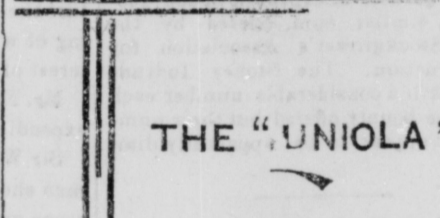

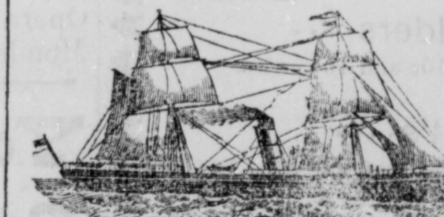
