ATHENS, Greece (AP) — A quake authority on earthquakes believes he has evidence of an ancient upheaval that could explain how Moses and his people crossed the Red Sea.

After years of poring through geological records, Prof. Angelo Galanopoulos claims he has proof that nearly 3,500 years ago the Mediterranean area was struck by the mightiest volcanic blast the world has ever known.
