Rewards for Service. LONDON, June 16. The House of Commons, yesterday, passed the grants to Lord Wolseley, of Cairo, and Lord Alcester, for their services during the Egyptian campaign.

Sir Charles Tupper. HALIFAX, June 16. Sir Charles Tupper sails for England on Monday.

The Tonquin Difficulty. HONG KONG, June 16. The Chinese commander of the Tonquin forces has given pacific assurances to the French Ministry.

Telegraph Notes. The village of Valloires, in the department of Savoy, has been destroyed by fire.

The sentences of the three other Nihilists condemned to death have been commuted to imprisonment for an indefinite period, and the sentences to imprisonment of five more have been reduced to various periods.

A cyclone passed over Long Island on Wednesday afternoon, mainly on Homestead Plains, causing sad havoc among buildings. Rain fell in torrents and the lightning was fierce, shattering many trees.

The recent action of Germany respecting the May laws and ecclesiastical legislation, has occasioned much difference of opinion at the Vatican, and there is a growing tendency in the highest quarters in favor of accepting the concessions offered by Germany, and of not destroying the intended legislation.

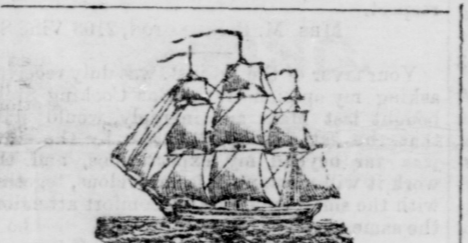
