Mr. Callbeck's Hogs Win Several Prizes.

Mr. J. W. Callbeck secured a good many prizes for hogs at the Halifax exhibition. Following is the detailed list:

IMPROVED LARGE YORKSHIRE.

Boar over 2 years, 3rd prize.
Boar, over 1 year and under 2 years, 2nd and 3rd prizes.
Boar, over 6 months and under 1 year, 3rd prize.
Boar, under 6 months, 3rd prize.
Sow, over 2 years, 3rd prize.
Sow over 1 year and under two years, 2nd prize.
Sow, over 6 months and under 1 year, 2nd prize.
Sow, under 6 months, 3rd prize.
Breeding sow, with litter—not less than 5 pigs, 2nd and 3rd prizes.
He also secured 1st for best pen of two pure bred hogs suitable for export bacon, bred and owned by the exhibitor.
First for best pen of two hogs of any breed, cross or grade most suitable for export bacon. In both sections the hogs were to weigh not less than 170, and not more than 200 lbs. The judge made special mention of the exhibit, and said the bacon hogs showed by him were equal to the best ever shown at Toronto.

ODDFELLOWSHIP.—The Sovereign Grand Lodge has just closed a most interesting session at Richmond, Va. The third day's session was largely taken up with a discussion regarding ritual. In the afternoon there was a grand parade of the uniformed bodies reviewed by Governor Tyler and his staff. Mr. T. B. Grady, of Summerside, was a delegate from Prince Edward Island.

SHOOTING.—No 2 Company 4th Regt C A, held a shooting match yesterday afternoon at Kensington Range for badges presented by the Dominion Artillery Association, the highest possible score being 40 pts. Ranges 200 and 400 yards. The badges were won as follows. First, Corpl L. F. Muncey, 36 pts; second, Sergt Jas Campbell, 31 pts; third, Corpl W. Dawson, 30 pts. The scores were exceptionally good, considering that this is the first time the company used the Lee-Enfield carbine.

THEIR HOUSE ROBBED.—A Fredericton, N. B. despatch says. On Thursday night last the residence of Willard Kitchen was entered and ransacked during the absence of the family in P. E. Island. Mr and Mrs Kitchen came home yesterday, and upon examination of the house found that about \$300 worth of jewelry and silverware had been taken by the burglars. Last night John Johnson, notorious as "English Jack," and a Woodstock man named Debooye were arrested upon suspicion of having committed the burglary and theft.

REV. MR. McLEOD'S DEATH.—Exchanges at hand this morning give particulars of the accident at Vankleek, Ont. a few days ago, of which THE EXAMINER, was advised by telegraph at the time. Rev. John McLeod, pastor of the church, lost his life by the accident. There were five men, together with Rev. Mr. McLeod, at the top of the gable end of the wall, which was just being finished. A crash was heard and a warning cry given. The entire wall began to topple over. It fell very slowly and some of the workmen jumped. Other workmen were not in a position to jump, and came down with the ruins. Two of the number were buried under the heavy cap stones and frightfully mangled. Rev. Mr. MacLeod, who was simply watching the workmen at their work, came down on top of the ruins and was struck with falling debris. He was picked up unconscious and carried to the manse next door, where he died without recognizing his wife and family of three young children. Rev. Mr. MacLeod came here from Richmond, Que, some years ago and was dearly beloved. His parents reside in Prince Edward Island.
