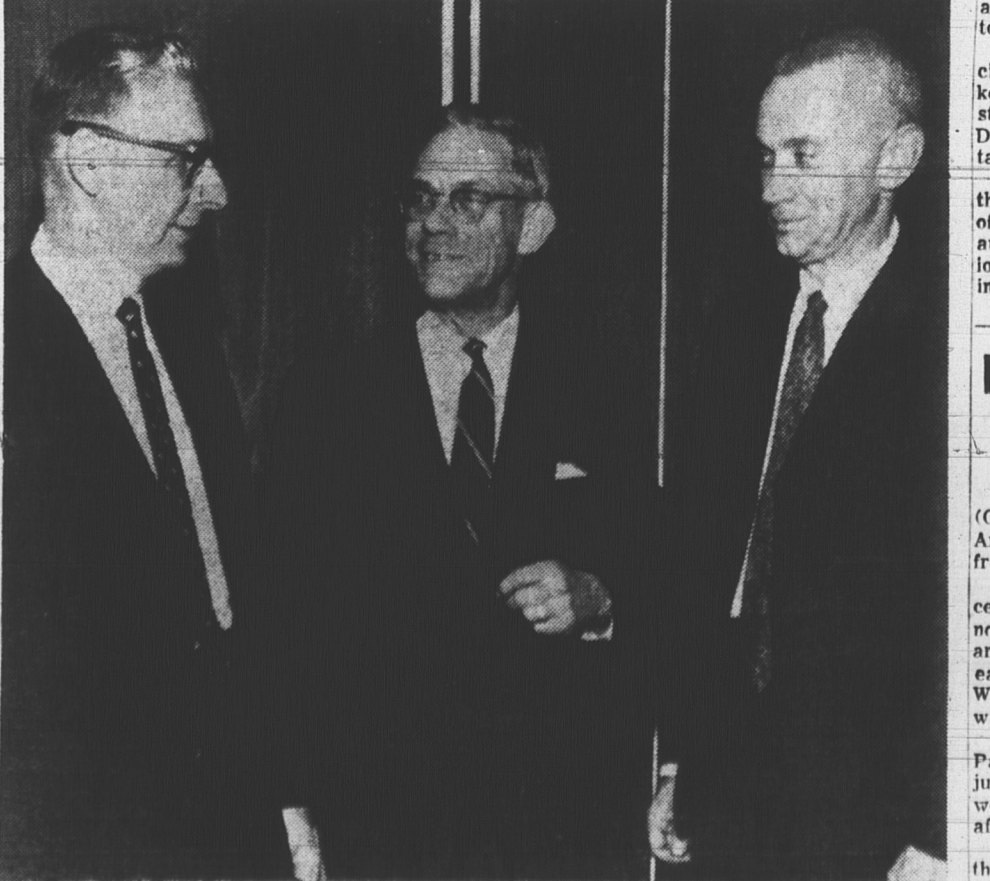
Progressive Conservative Candidates were nominated last night for the May 30 provincial election in First Queens and Fifth Kings.
