

# Giving Up Title Tough, Former Viscount Says

LONDON AP—Britain's House of Lords possesses a quaint feudal charm and little power. It often makes ambitious political figures feel as if trapped in a jar of honey. Yet how is it to leave that world—to be addressed as a lord one day and plain mister the next?

Quinn Hogg, outspoken son of a Tennessee-born mother, has undergone the experience. Imagine having a tooth pulled the same day and drop a notch socially. To give up a title is something like that, Hogg says. It was terrible—but he shows no signs of being sorry.

Hogg, 58, was a Viscount Halifax until last autumn. He cast his peerage away to gain a House of Commons seat and keep alive his hope of being prime minister.

Everything changed, including his name—and he had much preferred the sound of Halifax to Hogg, possibly because of childhood teasing.

"Even now I find it difficult to say Mrs. Hogg when I introduce my wife," he observed. "I became used to referring to her as Lady Halifax."

## N.Y. Stock Market Suffers First Loss in Seven Weeks

NEW YORK AP—The stock market backed away slightly last week taking its first loss in seven weeks.

By Wednesday the Dow Jones Industrial average had run up a string of nine straight daily advances to a 100-day high, reaching a closing peak of 800.25.

On Thursday the market drifted off hesitantly and irregularly. The profit-taking heightened on Friday when stocks sank to their worst loss since Jan. 29.

On balance the list took only a small loss for the week.

The Dow Jones industrial average of 60 stocks dipped 3 to 791.7, its first decline since the week ended Feb. 1.

## Seal Protection Is Questioned

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada has gone as far as it can at the present time in supervising sealing operations in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, Fisheries Minister Robichaud said in the Commons.

The next step is the meeting this summer of the North Atlantic Fisheries Commission which is preparing for fuller discussion than it held last year. Canada's contribution to supervision right now is about 100 officers and that is all it can do, he said.

Mr. Robichaud was replying to queries from Walter Dinsdale (PC—Brandon-Souris), New Democratic Leader T. C. Douglas, and Angus MacLean, former Conservative fisheries minister.

He was the government leader in the House of Lords and Harcourt was ending his run as prime minister.

Hogg gambled for the big prize of British politics. He competed with Lord Home, Richard A. Butler, Reginald Maudling and Iain Macleod. Home won, resigned his ancient title and now sits in the House of Commons as Prime Minister Sir Alec Douglas-Home.

Hogg's time still could come. He rallied the party after the confusion of the abortive British Suez operation in 1956. He is credited with organizing the Conservatives' 1959 election triumph.

And as he sits now in the House of Commons, his feet propped up on the dispatch box before him, he takes comfort in his popularity among party workers. He is also back in the main stream of British political life.

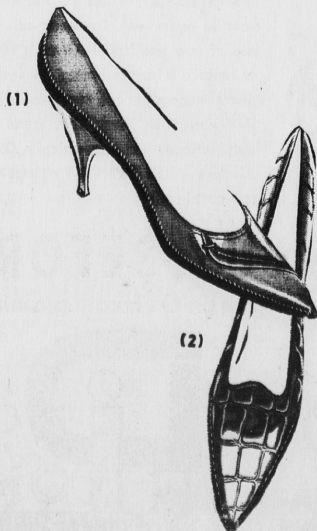
