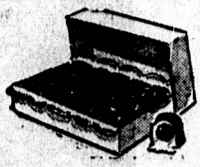
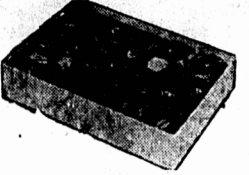

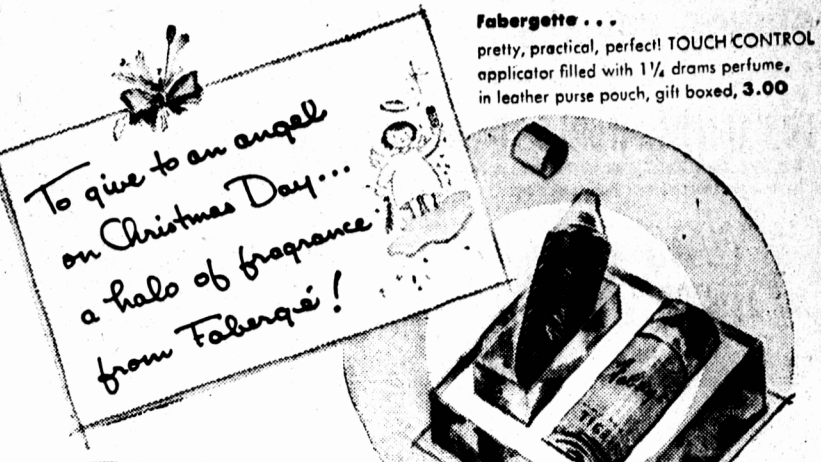

CHEESE BRAN MUFFINS

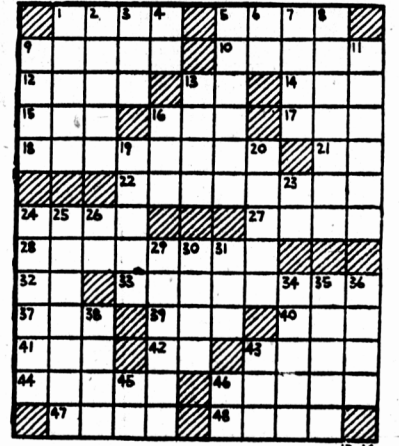
