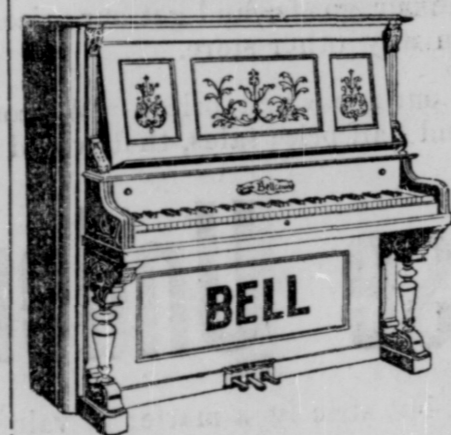

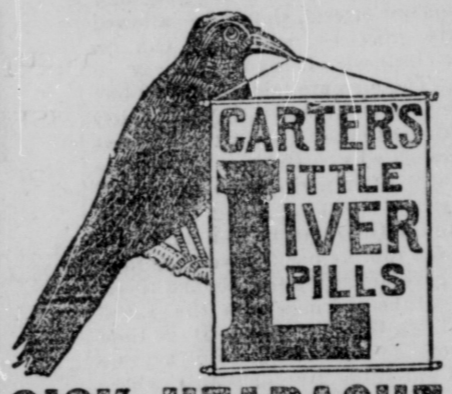
TEACHER AND PUPIL.

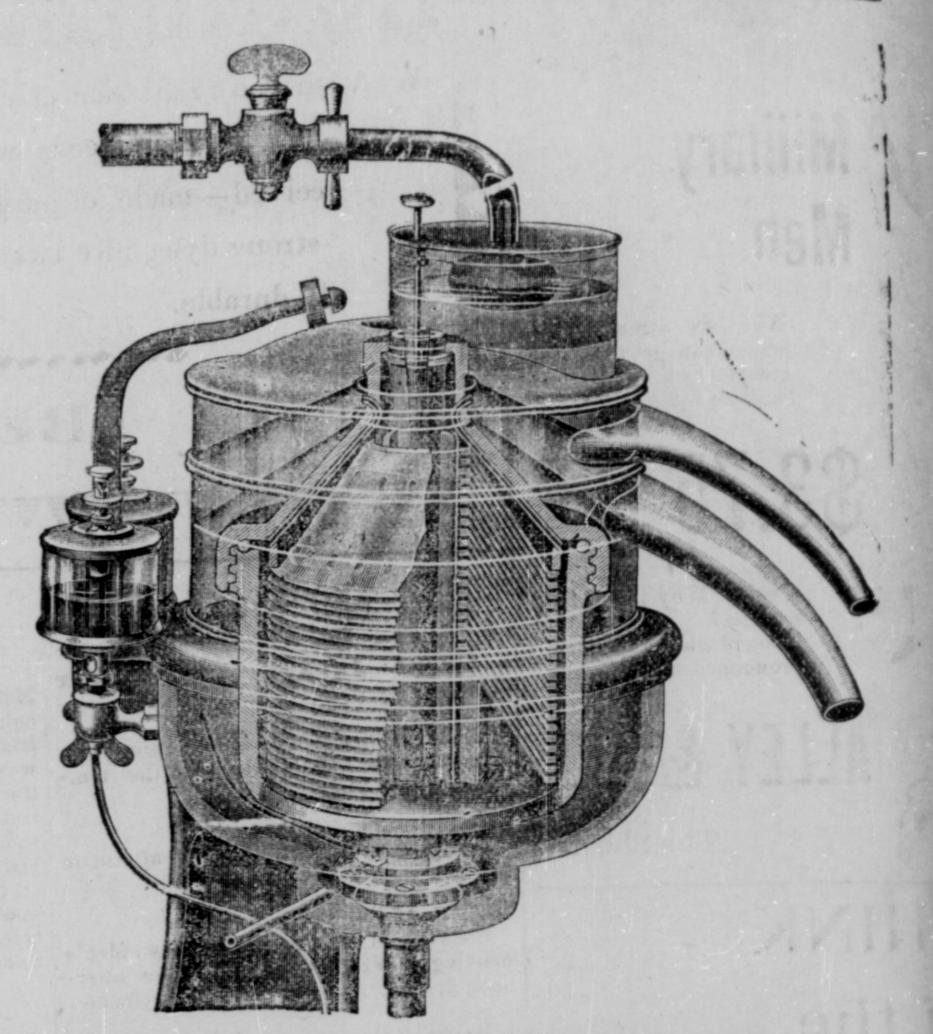
