The President was frustrated in his attempts at getting the recommendations passed by a successful stalling by the Faculty of Arts.

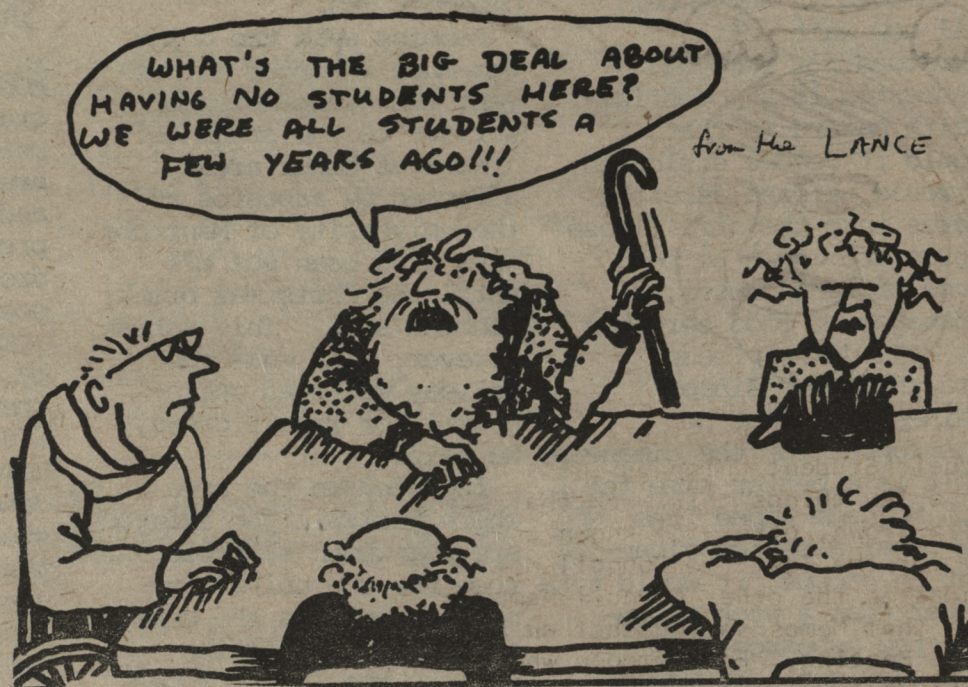
