Parliament is to meet Monday at 2:30 p.m.

An RCAF Yukon transport made available for Atlantic MPs will leave Summerside, P.E.I., at 2 p.m. local time Sunday, Shearwater near Halifax at 3:40 and Moncton at 5:15. The flight will arrive here at 7 p.m. EDT.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

You're right — hand opponent opens with Three Hearts, neither side vulnerable. What would you bid now with each of the following five hands?

1. ♠ A85 ♥ J ♦ AK7 ♣ KQ985
2. ♠ A9 ♥ KQ82 ♦ AK985 ♣ J6
3. ♠ A5 ♥ J74 ♦ AQ9885 ♣ AJ5
4. ♠ AK9832 ♥ 7 ♦ K6 ♣ A3J5
5. ♠ AK765 ♥ — ♦ KQ94 ♣ AQJ3

1. Double. The hand is too good for a mere overall of four clubs. While partner would read four clubs as showing a good hand, he could hardly expect it to have all these values. A four club bid would be more likely to show the same hand with the deuce of diamonds in place of the king.

The double is primarily for takeout. It indicates considerable strength and requests partner to reply accordingly. Partner is permitted to pass, thus changing the takeout double into a business double, whenever he thinks it is better to play for penalties.

2. Three notrump. This bid means what it says — a desire to play in notrump. Partner is not being asked to bid and should do so only when he has good reason to believe that a suit contract is better. It would be dangerous to double because there is almost no chance of partner's passing and his response might carry the bidding past three notrump.

3. Pass. Little can be gained

her grandfather's house within 24 hours after she and her motor arrived in West Berlin for a family reunion. The federal boat was towed ashore until special dispensation was granted. M-F Profit Shows Increase

TORONTO (CP) — Massey-Ferguson Ltd. had no profit of \$2,700,000 or \$2.01 a share in the nine months ended July 31 compared with \$23,500,000 or \$1.57 in the same period last year.

President Albert A. Thornbrough said sales were \$683,200,000 compared with \$566,300,000 last year.

He said that while sales were up 20 per cent they were below expectations because of severe drought conditions in South Africa and Australia.

Sales in North America were up \$59,700,000 and in Europe by \$47,500,000.

CONVICT DIES

KINGSTON (CP) — Harvard Mulder, 53, serving a life sentence for non-capital murder in Kingston penitentiary died Wednesday from a heart attack in Canadian Forces Hospital, Harfield. The father of 12 children was sentenced July 25, 1965 for the slaying of his wife in a shack near their home in Harrow, near Windsor, then shot away his lower jaw in an unsuccessful bid to commit suicide. He was in hospital undergoing plastic surgery when he died.

MEDICAL AID ARRIVES

TRENTON, Ont. (CP) — An RCAF official here said Thursday that an aircraft containing provisions for earthquake victims in Turkey will arrive at its destination tonight. The aircraft loaded with drugs, medical supplies, blankets, and clothes valued at \$35,000 left the RCAF base Wednesday. Of the amount contributed, \$20,000 was a gift of the Canadian government and \$15,000 was from the Canadian Red Cross.
