### Dr. Stanton Will Defend Pacing Ch'ship Friday

TORONTO, Aug. 29 — (CP) — The old champion—Dr. Stanton—comes back to Thorncliffe Raceway Friday to defend his Canadian pacing championship in the Dominion's richest harness race—the Canadian Cup.

The race will be run in two heats with the winners sharing the \$25,000 prize.

Dr. Stanton will meet five red-hot rivals, including two American challengers—Hodgen and Royal Man.

Hodgen, from the stable of Mrs. Mildred Knisely, Toledo, Ohio, has paced the mile in 1:58.3/5 and has won more than \$65,000 in purses. Royal Man has won \$75,000.

But the \$141,000 winnings of Dr. Stanton, owned by Lindey Fraser of Forest, Ont., constitute a world record for pacing geldings.
