EATS \$5,000 A DAY.
That is the Sum the Sultan of Turkey
Spends on His Table and its
Seated Dishes.

By far the most extravagant diner in
the world is the Sultan of Turkey. His
table expenses total up to \$5,000 a day,
or \$1,825,000 a year. It is the most ex-
pensive table and household, in all prob-
ability, that any country has ever seen.
He is not a sociable man, and very
rarely receives his visitors. The
Sultan does not even have a dining
room or dining hall. Turkish custom
among the higher classes is for ser-
vants to bring the meals at the dinner
hour first search out His Majesty, and
then in long procession bring in the
banquet, table and all!

The table is of silver, and perhaps
the most exquisite table that has ever
been made. It is set on the process-
ion, borne in upon the shoulders of
lower grade servants. Following come
a long line of jubbalkars, who are
cooks and waiters. On the heads of
these are large tables, on which are
platters. Such an equable balance do
these jubbalkars keep that an accident,
even the breaking of a dish, has never
been known.

The waiters lift the platters from
the tables and present each dish to
His Majesty without any regard to
are covered and sealed with a silver
seal, which is put on in the
kitchen by the grand vizier, so that
he is sure to be certain that the
food has not been tampered with.
With all at once the dishes are set
upon the table, vegetable, meats, fish
and sweets being arranged in front of
His Majesty's seat. The Sultan's
courses or ordinary dinner regulations.
When the whole repast is placed be-
fore him he runs his eye over the many
dishes. Then he picks and chooses,
eating the whole simultaneously, a
pick here and a bite there, a mouth-
ful of meat, a spoonful of ice, a sweet
cake and a half of fish. He is a
total abstainer, and never has wine on
the table. At State dinners rare vi-
vants are provided for those seated at
other than the Imperial board.

The Olympic Volcanic Eruption.
PORT TOWNSEND, Wash., Oct. 21.—For
the first time in over 30 years the Olympic
range of mountains has broken forth, and
in one section is belching out fire and lava
in large quantities. The eruption is what
is known as a volcanic chain, and is esti-
mated to be 30 miles back of the city of Port
Angeles, situated on the straits of Juan
de Fuca.

From In Ontario.
Mr. Archibald Blue, director of the
Bureau of Mines of Ontario, has just
returned from a trip through Ontario
to the iron ore of this part of the
province, he said: "I was never sure
before that there was a large supply of
the red ore of iron in Ontario, but I have
no doubts now. The range is said to
extend from Hunter's Island to the
Kaministiquia River, and beyond it,
the famous Vermilion range of Minne-
sota. We got upon it near Green-
water Lake, south of Lake Shebaw-
an, where there is a deposit of solid
ore of fine quality 50 feet thick. The
northern exposure is a bluff 30 feet
high, and Mr. Hammond told us that
it has a length of nearly half a mile.
Twelve or fifteen miles farther east,
in the Mattawan Valley, we came upon
the range again. There it appears as
a little mountain over 100 feet high,
to 400 feet wide, and about a quar-
ter of a mile long. A mile eastward
is another mountain, higher, wider,
and longer, but showing more Jasper,
especially on the western slope. There
are eight of these hills in succession
down to and beyond the Mattawan
River, and I do not believe that either
the Vermilion or the Mesaba ranges
of Minnesota can show any orebodies
larger or better. No, I have no fears
now of a scarcity of hematite iron
ores in Ontario," the director said, in
his quiet way, "and is 20 to 30 miles
of the new railway would connect the
iron ore with the C.P.R. or the Port
Arthur, Duluth and Western roads.
There are very large deposits of mag-
netic iron ore," he said, "on the
Atikokan River; the largest, no doubt,
that we possess in Ontario. But they
are 50 miles from a railway, and for
some time to come it is hardly likely
that the price of ore will warrant the
cost of a railway to reach them. But
they have kept a long time, and when
wanted they will be there. Let the
United States produce 15,000,000 tons of
pig iron a year and good authorities
say they will begin to do so by the
beginning of the twentieth century,
and how long do you suppose it will
be before necessarily complete an open-
ing of iron mines in Ontario? For my
own part, however, I should greatly pre-
fer to see our ores smelted at
home. With so much raw material
we ought to have an iron industry of
our own, instead of importing nine-
tenths of all the iron and steel we
require from Great Britain and the
United States."

A Grand Prix for Cyclists.
The Paris Town Council proposes to
found a Grand Prix de Paris for cy-
clists, but it will only be for \$400. Our
Paris correspondent says: "Cycling
seems to advance in arithmetical pro-
gression. There are cycling-dress de-
partments for ladies and gentlemen in
all the great shops like the Bon Marche
and at the Merchant Tailors'. The
Velodrome, at the Champ de Mars,
makes a fortune, though the city re-
ceives from it a rent of 30,000 francs
and six per cent. of all the money
taken at the doors. This royalty last
year brought in 25,000 francs. The last
contest, taken with a view to taxation,
returned 50,000 in the Department of
the Seine. There are perhaps double
the number now, as women are tak-
ing up the cycle as a means of enjoying
cool country air in the evening. Every
one who cycles is delighted with their
exercise and the sense of freedom that
it gives. It brings townspeople into
the country without any of the town
consequences. I have friends who cycle
to Dieppe on Saturday and back to
Paris on Monday."
