

# Smallwood's Action Is Called Despicable

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) — A president of the Canadian Labor situation where the premier of Congress, told the Newfoundland province refuses to meet an organization is "absolutely despicable," John Simonds, vice-

Mr. Simonds said it is up to the Newfoundland people to do something about the situation. It should be made an issue at every trade union meeting. The NFL, in the second day of its three-day annual convention here also heard from James J. Greene, leader of the Progressive Conservative opposition in the province's legislature. Mr. Green said Newfoundland Labor Relations Act still has

many undesirable features, and "while we can't do anything about it, we hope that sooner or later we will be able to persuade the people to do something about it for themselves." The most improper piece of legislation to come before the last session of the legislature was a bill designed to provide for compulsory arbitration in hospital disputes, Mr. Greene said. The right to strike if taken away as in the case of hospital workers, should be replaced with something of equal value, he said.

Mr. Simonds disclosed that the NFL, the CLC, and other union executives held a meeting Thursday night to discuss what he felt is a move in Newfoundland to coak local unions away from international affiliation. Every effort should be made to step up labor education in the province, Mr. Simonds said, and he believes a crash program in trade union education will soon be underway. Among several resolutions studied Friday, one called for a provincial royal commission to study the use and effect of

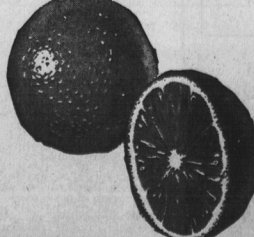
