

Referendum notice

The referendum that has been called for April 6 and 7 on whether the Robertson Library Lounge should be a smoking area or smoke-free space is rapidly approaching. However, before voting on such an issue, one should be aware of the possibilities that exist if the vote goes one way or the other.

If the Pit area remains a smoking area:

The Board of Governors will look into installing a ventilation system into the Pit at a cost of approximately 40,000-50,000 dollars.

If the Pit becomes a smoke-free space:

There is the possibility that that area that is now the Information office, located directly adjacent to the Pit, can become a smoking area. The proposal would have to go to the Board of Governors for approval and such renovations to this area would cost approximately 1/5 the cost of the ventilation system.

It should be noted that no matter how the vote goes, the renovations that will occur in either the Pit or the Information Office are only possibilities. Nothing has been guaranteed. The Board of Governors wants to hear the Student Council's recommendation on this matter and the Council's recommendation will in all

likelihood be the deciding factor in their decision. The results of this referendum will clearly be the Student Council's recommendation, however, the final decision will be in the hands of the Board of Governors.

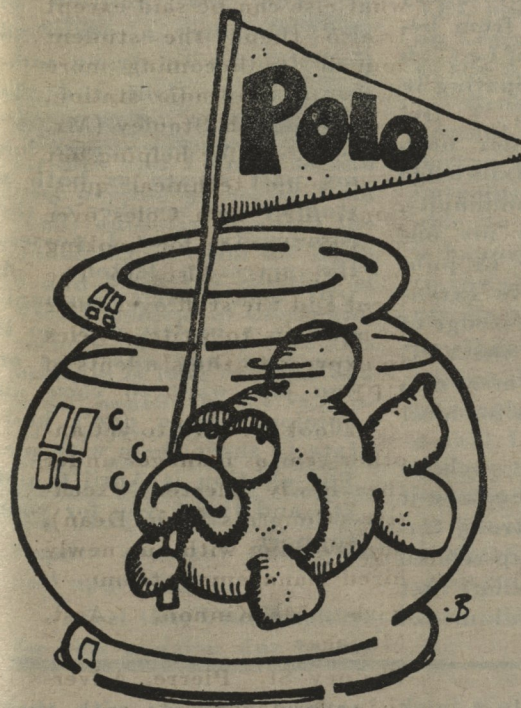

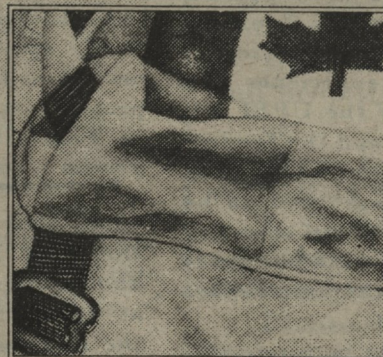
