Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP) — The stock market wound up Friday with a flurry of enthusiasm over speculative copper. Industrials were irregular while selected western oils gained smartly.

Volume of 3,677,000 shares, was the lowest of the week. Refining oils, papers and banks improved moderately, but the steels were dull. Trans Mountain led higher issues with a \$2 advance and Price Brothers gained the same.

Flahrs Bank slipped \$2.50 and Eddy Paper lost \$2.

Best of the advancing mines were Merrill Island, up 40 cents, and Mogul, up 35. Gase Copper eased \$1.

Index changes: Industrials up 1.42 to 473.90, golds up .77 to 88.36, base metals up .67 to 247.31, and western oils up .37 to 155.93.

N. Y. Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—Stong demand for railroads and other key issues Friday sent the stock market ahead in its best advance in a month.

Steel, motors and some oils provided initial encouragement for the advance. Later in the session railroads took over leadership and sent the market to its best levels at the final bell.

Union Pacific was up 4 1/4 at 185, Reynolds Metals up 3 1/4 at 74, and Gulf Oil up 4 1/4 at 113.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks gained 1.30 at 188.70. The jump was the best since March 22. The railroad component did best with a gain of \$2.20 at \$149.00, a high since 1929. Industrials were up \$1.70 while utilities backed down 30 cents.

Volume came to 2,320,000 shares as compared with 2,210,000 shares Thursday. Steel topped the most active list up 1 1/4 at 62.

Canadian issues on the New York exchange were mixed. Detroit Seagram added 1/4, Aluminum Ltd. gained 1/4, International Nickel moved up 1/4 and Canadian Pacific added 1/4.

Hiram Walker fell 1/4, Hudson Bay Mining lost 1/4, McIntyre dropped 1/4 and Granby Mining fell 1/4.

On the American exchange Canadian stocks were mixed with many unchanged. Shawinigan was up 1/4. Preston East Dome gained 1/4 and Jupiter Oils advanced 1-1/2.

Loblaws B fell 1/4, Fargo Oil slipped 3-1/2 and Great West Grass Oil lost 1-1/2.

The stock exchange's closing averages show banks up 0.03 at 56.69, utilities unchanged at 136.6, industrials up 0.3 at 318.9, combined up 0.2 at 258.1, papers up 18.93 at 1573.58 and golds up 0.85 at 86.01.
