The Stratford Festival's Artistic Director, John Hirsch has made public his initial program for the 1983 season.

At the Festival Theatre, the season will include Shakespeare's Macbeth, Richard II and As You Like It, together with Tartuffe by Moliere.

Leading off the season at the Avon Theatre will be two musical extravaganzas by Gilbert and Sullivan: THE GONDOLIERS and a revival of THE MIKADO, which proved to be one of the Festival's biggest hits in 1982. Joining the Avon Theatre repertory will be William Wycherley's

Restoration comedy THE COUNTRY WIFE and Henrik Ibsen's AN ENEMY OF THE PEOPLE.

The third stage season will start at the same time as the Festival and Avon season in June with one production of drama, still to be announced, and a series of Virtuoso Performances. The spirited Shakespeare 3 Company, initiated last season, will again be in residence at the Third Stage, presenting a season of two plays by Shakespeare: LOVE'S LABOR LOST and MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING. Actual productions at the Third Stage at this time remain subject to change.

In addition the season will include the popular fringe activities Meet The Festival and the Celebrity Lecture Series. There will also be a series of popular music concerts at the Festival Theatre.
