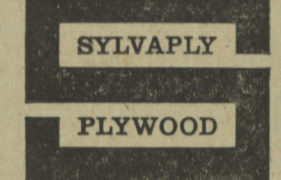

Councillor 'Washes Hands' Of S'ide Sewer Contract

SUMMERSIDE BUREAU OF THE GUARDIAN Councillor Robert Dewar, chairman of the water and sewerage committee, of the Summerside Town Council, told the council last evening that he would have nothing further to do with a contract which had previously been awarded to the M.F. Schurman Company Ltd., for the installation of a water and sewerage system presently being installed to serve the Hillcrest housing development. Councillor Dewar made the announcement during the regular December meeting of the Summerside Town Council last evening, after Councillor Leo Wood, a member of the water and sewerage committee, had protested that the Schurman contract was costing the town \$69,000 and that consulting engineer William Crandall had quoted a price of \$41,000.
