Two Britons Mowed Down In Nicosia

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP)—Two Britons were mowed down by machine-gun fire in the Turkish sector of Larnaca in south Cyprus Monday, according to a police communique broadcast by Cyprus radio.

The communique said the two Britons, dressed in civilian clothes, "fell heavily wounded or dead." Later reports said one had been killed and the other wounded.

Larnaca is the home of thousands of British servicemen based at the nearby base of Dhekelia.

Apart from the death of a British-naturalized Turk in Nicosia earlier in the day, the Larnaca shooting was the first incident in three days of inter-communal fighting that has resulted in British casualties.
