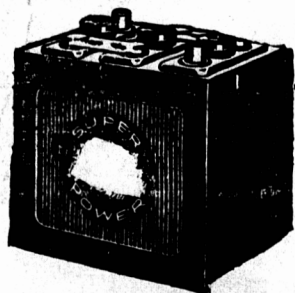

### Program For Naval Training Afloat

OTTAWA, April 26—(CP) — About 2,500 members of the Royal Canadian Navy Reserve and Naval Cadets will be training afloat this summer.

A comprehensive program to be carried out on both coasts and on the Great Lakes was announced today by naval headquarters. It will start early in May and continue till the end of September.

Besides training at sea, reserves and cadets will receive instruction in R. C. N. technical schools and training centres at Halifax and Esquimalt, B. C. The instruction will enable reserve men to qualify for the non-substantive ratings necessary for advancement in their respective branches.

Two frigates on each coast—the Swansea and La Hulloise at Halifax, the Beacon Hill and Antigonish at Esquimalt—will be engaged in training cadets. They will also give sea experience to officers and men of the reserve.

In addition, the aircraft carrier Magnificent at Halifax, and destroyers on both coasts, will be used for training as their operational commitments permit.

The minesweepers Sault Ste. Marie and Llewellyn, attached to the naval divisions at Victoria and Halifax respectively, will augment the general program with a number of summer cruises for personnel of the two divisions.

### Wreckage May Be From Missing Plane

STOCKHOLM, April 26—(AP) — An American Embassy spokesman said tonight a wrecked landing gear picked up yesterday in the Baltic contained a marker which "indicates that it belonged to a plane of the same type" as the missing United States Navy Privateer.

The United States has charged that the plane was shot down by Russia over the open Baltic April 8. The plane carried a crew of 10, none of whom have been accounted for. They are presumed dead.

Earlier a Swedish naval staff expert expressed the opinion that the Russians shot down the missing plane 28 miles outside the 12-mile limit claimed by Russia in the Baltic.

### "Day Of Grace" For Income Tax Returns

OTTAWA, April 26— Canadians have a "day of grace" this year in filing their income tax returns.

A Revenue Department official said tonight that because April 30 falls on a Sunday, Canadians have until May 1 to send in their returns. Normally the deadline for filing the returns is midnight April 30.

Earlier the Department announced that the deadline for filing income tax returns is midnight April 30 and that district income tax offices will be kept open until 8 p. m. local time Saturday to help late filers.

From the time the Income Tax forms became available early in February last, up to and including April 17th., no less than 1,864,637 returns have been filed, as compared with a total of more than 3,300,000 expected to be filed by April 30th. In other words, 56 per cent. of the 1949 returns have already been filed, and thousands more are daily pouring into the District Offices as the deadline approaches. Officials of the Taxation Division cannot recall a similar rush to file returns early in other years.

During the month of March and early in April, close to 350,000 taxpayers have visited the District Income Tax Offices across Canada for the chief purpose of obtaining assistance in completing their returns. In other years, most taxpayers waited until the last two or three weeks in April to ask the District Income Tax Offices for assistance.

One of the reasons for the early rush to file returns is the fact that a large number of persons are entitled to Income Tax Refunds. As a result of the 1949 Budget, it was estimated that 20 per cent. of individual taxpayers would be entitled to refunds when they filed their 1949 returns. At the close of business on April 17th last, 662,000 refunds had been approved.
