### Rumor Canadian Held By Cuban Gov't. Agents

NIAGARA - ON - THE - LAKE, Ont. (CP)—The 19-year-old wife of a Canadian professional football player who may be in the custody of Cuban government agents said Sunday night she didn't even know he was in the Caribbean republic until this weekend. Rebecca Paquette said her husband, rookie defensive end Don Paquette, phoned her last Tuesday from Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and told her that he and traveling companion Enslie Clark, 22, also of Niagara-on-the-Lake, would be home for Christmas. Paquette and Clark went to Florida on vacation at the end of the football season. "He didn't say anything about going to Cuba," Paquette played his first season of pro football the year with the Hamilton Tiger-Cats of the Big Four League. First word that Paquette and Clark might be held in custody came Saturday from Wisconsin vacationer Eugene Ertman, 24, who told police in Key West, Fla., that he had been jailed and mistreated by Cuban authorities who could still be holding the two Canadians. The external affairs department in Ottawa said Sunday night it had received no word of Canadians being held. However, it was to make inquiries on the basis of news reports of statements by Mr. Ertman and Mrs. Paquette.
