## Somerville Leads Canuck Brigade In Qualifying Round Of U. S. Amateur

CHICAGO, Sept. 12 (CP)—C. Ross (Sandy) Somerville of London, Ont., led the Canadian Brigade today in the qualifying play of the 1940 United States Amateur Golf Championships by adding a 73 to yesterday's 71 for a two-day total of 144 which easily qualified him for the start of match play tomorrow.

Back of Sandy, United States amateur champion in 1932, the next Canadian was little Joe Thompson of Burlington, Ont., who carded 72 yesterday and slipped to 77 today for 149. He too qualified easily.

As the scores were tallied it developed that all with 154 gained match play spots and 16 players with 155 started out over the course again in a battle for the last four places in the match play field of the 64 low qualifying scores.

Among this latter group was Phil Parley of Toronto who scored 75 yesterday and added an 80 today.

And it was a good golfing day for the Canadians it was also a hot day for the Irish.

Three sons of Old Erin—Tom Sheehan, Maurice McCarthy and B. Patrick Abbott—made the windup qualifying program a grand battle amongst themselves.

Sheehan, a husky 22-year-old from Detroit, came out of the trap on top with a great 36-hole total of 139. It gave him medalist honors—and more. His aggregate clipped two shots off the all-time 36-hole qualifying record for the 43-year-old championship.

McCarthy was the kingpin most of the day with a 142 total before Sheehan took command. Shortly after Sheehan had come turning off North Shore's 18th green, Abbott posted his 143 total, which gave him third place in the qualifying duel.

## Philippino & Italian May Decide Title

WASHINGTON, Sept. 12 (AP)—The United States Boxing Association convention declared the world flyweight championship vacant today and voted to recognize today the winner of a 15-round contest between Little Dado of the Philippines and Enrico Ubbinati of Italy.

Delegates voted to recognize Dado as the champion 90 days from today if Ubbinati declines to meet Dado.

In the bantamweight division, the Association ruled that Sixto Escobar, the champion, be given until Nov. 2 to make a match with George Pace, of Cleveland.

It was stipulated that if Escobar does not accept Pace's challenge by Nov. 2, the Association will declare the championship vacant, and then recognize as round bout between Pace and Peter Kane of England.

The delegates voted to declare Pace the title holder in the event both Escobar and Kane fail to meet Pace.

## Possibility Seen Of Games Being Held In U. S.

LAKE PLACID, N. Y., Sept. 12 (AP)—Due to war developments, possibility of holding the 1940 Winter Olympics in this Adirondack Mountain resort was considered here today. The 1932 Winter Olympic Games were staged here.

In a telegram to town supervisor Willis Wells, Avery Brundage, President of the United States Olympic Committee, said "if the games cannot be held in Europe" he would favor holding them in Lake Placid.

The games were awarded to Germany last year by the International Olympic Committee. Germany also was the scene of the 1936 games, held at Garmisch-Partenkirchen.

## Cape Breton Official Named Bd. President

SYDNEY, N. S., Sept. 12 (CP)—Judge A. D. Campbell, president of the Cape Breton Colliery Baseball League, was notified today by the National Association of Professional Baseball that he has been selected chairman of the board that will supervise this year's "Little World Series" between the International League and American Association winners.

## Moore's Homer Gives Cards 3-2 Victory

NEW YORK, Sept. 12 (AP)—Terry Moore's home gun with one on in the seventh inning drove in the tying and winning runs as St. Louis Cardinals continued their National Baseball League pennant drive today with a 4-3 victory over Philadelphia Phillies.

Hank Leiber and Rip Russell hit homers, Leiber with the bases loaded, to help Bill Lee score his 17th triumph as Chicago Cubs trounced Boston Bees 8-3.

Some late but timely clouting by Billy Myers and Buck McConnick enabled the Reds to come from behind for a 10-inning 3-2 decision over Brooklyn Dodgers to maintain their 3 1-2 game pace at the head of the League.

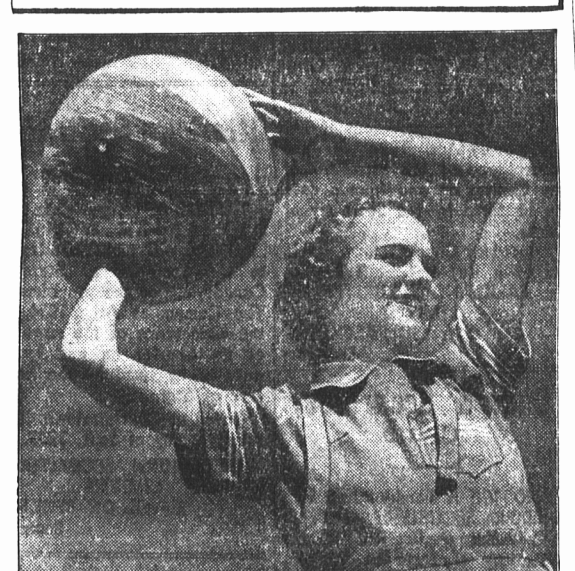
His identity was established after he regained consciousness today. Police described him as a hitch-hiker, and said he had fallen from the back of a truck.

## The SNAPSHOT GUILD ACTION SHOOTING



A subject such as this will make a good "action sequence"—a series of pictures showing the complete toss, step by step. Pose your subject in "slow motion," and it's easy.

**ACTION shooting** is one of the most interesting phases of amateur photography—and good action pictures can be obtained with any camera, if you know how.

To "stop" true fast action, and get sharp pictures, you need a fast shutter—one that can be adjusted to 1/400 or 1/500 second. Such a camera is a wise investment if you intend to do much shooting of unposed action subjects—you simply set the shutter for top speed, adjust the lens opening for correct exposure at that speed, and fire away.

With slower cameras, however, you can still get good action pictures if you pose your subject in slow motion. Let him go through the natural motions of the sport—golf, tennis, or whatever you choose—but have him move as slowly as possible. Then shoot when the action looks most effective.

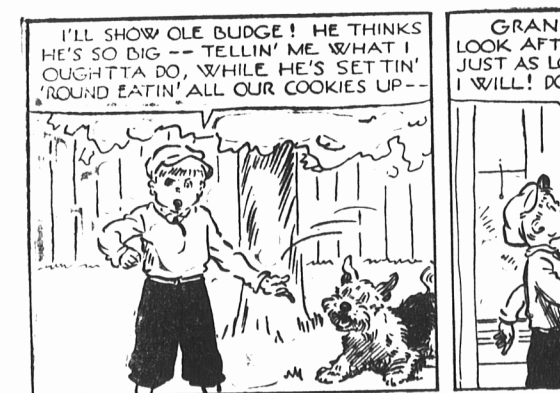
This trick will work for box cameras, as well as the many excellent folding cameras whose shutters adjust no higher than 1/100 second. And it is marvelously effective if well done, the pictures retaining a genuine appearance of fast action.

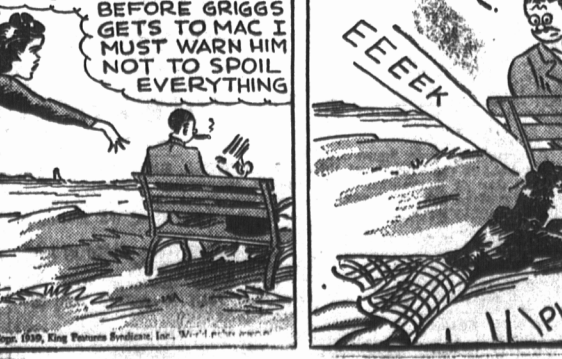
