SUCCESSFUL ISLANDER AT HOME.—TRADERS OUTWITTED.—A young man of comparatively meagre business knowledge commenced a trade in the manufacture of potato-boxes a short time ago and has, since commencement, prosecuted that branch of business quite lucratively—as far as he himself was concerned. A few days ago he solicited orders for a large number of boxes from several traders in the city, and with the orders received large advances—as the boxes were in great demand. He purchased the material from the proprietor of a well known sash factory, and was soon busily engaged in their construction. When he had completed the five hundredth box he was tempted. He yielded; and going into another trader, arranged the sale of the five hundred. He received cash in hand; and with it and the advances, left the Island for parts unknown.

OBITUARY.—This morning, at half-past two o'clock, Sister St. Florentin departed this mortal life in the Convent de Notre Dame. She had been ill three weeks, her disease being inflammation of the lungs. Sister St. Florentin was fourteen years a Nun. Five of these she spent in Charlottetown. She is the first member of her Order to die in this Island. All acquainted with her, sorrow the loss of one who was "good" in the highest sense of the term, and whose life was spent in the Christian duty of "doing good." Her remains will be conveyed to Montreal—leaving here to-morrow morning. The funeral service will be held at the head-quarters of the Order—the Convent de Notre Dame in Montreal. His Lordship the Bishop of Charlottetown will accompany Sister Florentin's remains thither.
