Local and Other Items.

LOVE AS A LEVELER.—At Cape Ray, Newfoundland, the other day a lady of 68 years took for her third husband a young man of 23. It is asserted that the latter is a lone orphan "without a home" and the lady owns a house and farm. But "love levels all ranks."

LIGHTING AT OTTAWA.—Ottawa is to be lighted by electricity generated with water power. The Metropolitan Electric Co. of that city has purchased a water power at Britannia, six miles above the city, for \$20,000, and will have cheap power available by the spring. The capacity is said to be 40,000 horse power.

MUCH WHEAT SPOILED.—According to a despatch from Winnipeg continued wet weather has sadly darkened the prospects of Manitoba farmers of the estimated wheat crop. Of twenty-six million bushels only about eight million have been threshed. It looks as if a greater part of the remainder will be most seriously damaged. If not totally destroyed.

BIG MINING DEAL.—It is announced from Halifax that one of the largest mining deals ever brought to a head in Nova Scotia is now on. A syndicate of Halifax men control the transaction. The purchasers are a large English concern who had representatives in Halifax all summer. Hundreds of thousands of dollars are involved and some very fine properties are included in the bunch.

EMERSON'S SON AS AN AUTHOR.—Ralph Waldo Emerson's son, Dr Edward Emerson, himself a boy when Louisa Alcott was a girl in Concord, has written an article on "when Louisa was a Girl." Which The Ladies' Home Journal is about to publish. Doctor Emerson gives a new view of the author of "Little Men"—as a mimic, and as the central figure of every dance and merrymaking in old Concord.

LOTS OF SNOW.—A fisherman who arrived lately from Labrador states that on Sept. 23rd two feet of snow fell on the Labrador coast. Such a heavy fall of snow has rarely or ever been known to take place so early. From the 20th of August to the 25th of September the coast was being continually swept with fierce gales preventing boats from going to the grounds. Not for 30 years has there been such stormy weather experienced.—Sydney Record.

THE OAR.—Halifax will likely have a big aquatic event in the spring. Friends of the Lynches have decided to accept the challenge from the English champions Bubeare and Barry for a double-scul race for stake of \$5,000—2,500 a side. The Englishmen will be allowed £50 expenses to have the race rowed in Halifax. This is the sum named by Bubeare and Barry, and friends of the Lynches have decided to allow that sum.

HE WANTS DAMAGE.—Mr A. Charron, of Montreal, is a disappointed lover whose heart has been damaged, by the loss of his lady-love, to the value of \$70. He seeks to recover the sum from Miss MarieCourte, who promised to marry him in December January, February, April and June last. He claims also \$129.00 further, as the value of the engagement presents which he made her, and which she is taking now, with her heart and hand, to another man. Mr Charron began legal action in Montreal a few days ago.

CRUDED TO DEATH.—A man named Kelly Hachey, of Bathurst Village employed in the lumber woods, met with a frightful death while on his way to the camp near Bathurst on Wednesday. He and another man were taking out a wagon-load of flour, molasses and pork, etc., for the camp, and Hachey was riding on top of the load. The Portage road over which they were going was very rough and striking a side hill the load capsized, Hachey going down underneath. A barrel of molasses fell on him and inflicted fatal injuries.
