CROP INSURANCE FOR 1962

Potato crop insurance against, hail, drought,
excessive rainfall, flood, frost, wind, including
tornadoes, disease, including blight and pests is
now available on application to the Crop Insur-
ance Agency of the Provincial Government, 123
Kent Street, Charlottetown or their agents in
Prince, Queens and Kings Counties, at a cost to
the grower of \$5.06 per acre payable at the time
of application.

This provides a maximum coverage of
\$158.05 per acre and is a guarantee against crop
failure when your yield drops below 145 bushels
of marketable potatoes.

Application should be made not later than
May 31st, 1962.

ATTENTION

Potato Growers And Operators
Of Potato Machinery

All potato growers and operators of potato
machinery are reminded of the amendment to the
"Plant Disease Eradication Act" which has refer-
ence to the disinfecting of potato machinery and
the registering annually of operators of such
machines.

All farmers, or others, who operate Potato
Planters, Set Cutters, and other equipment used
in the handling of potatoes on more than their
own farms, must apply immediately to the Pro-
vincial Department of Agriculture, Box 2000, Char-
lottetown, for a license and enclose the license fee
of fifty cents (50c). When application for a li-
cense is received a record book will be forwarded
to the operator and the receipt of the record book
will be evidence that the operator has registered.
Operators of custom machines should contact the
Seed Potato Inspector in their respective areas,
or the Prince Edward Island Department of
Agriculture, for instructions in the proper method
of disinfecting their machines.

REMEMBER TO TREAT YOUR SEED BE-

AND OTHER DISEASES.

ATTENTION
POTATO GROWERS

The attention of all farmers is directed to an
amendment of the Prince Edward Island Potato
Production Act passed in 1962 whereby all per-
sons planting one-quarter acre or more of pota-
toes must plant those of the "Certified" class or
better unless written authority is received from
the Minister of Agriculture.

Also be advised that any grower whose field
or land has borne a crop of potatoes infected with
any plant disease or pest shall not permit the
same area to be planted to potatoes the following
year except on the authority of an Inspector, and
shall destroy any volunteer plants on such land.

Areas so infected in 1961 will be policed to
see that these regulations are strictly enforced.

It is the intention to inspect all fields of
potatoes grown this year and growers are advised
to retain and have available for the Inspector
their seed tags or the written authority from the
Minister to plant seed of table stock origin.
